

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Faith-fully Blessed. That was the theme that was chosen for this year as we celebrated our congregation's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Yet, like everything else planned for this year, our anniversary celebration was drastically scaled back and much of it was cancelled. A summer block party, a guest preacher, two concerts, and other fellowship activities have been called off and even our 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary pictorial directory has been delayed due its production being classified as "non-essential." Even with all these disappointments, our theme remains as strong now as it was six months ago.

Looking back over 75 years, we are reminded that God remains faithful even when the world is rapidly changing around us. Our congregation has seen the end of World War II, the wars in Korea, Vietnam, Desert Storm, Iraq and Afghanistan. It has prayed for those hurt and grieved with those who mourned after the terrorist attacks on 9-11. It has survived the social unrest of the 60s, internal conflicts and external pressures, and has had budgets that scarce and others that were abundantly met. The perspective of 75 years reminds us that while the challenges of today include elements that are familiar (social unrest, election anxiety, etc.) and some that are new (social isolation, quarantine, drastically different school years, masks) one thing continues to remain the same; God is faithful.

As we look to the fall, we are reminded of how different things are in our congregation as well. For the first time, we will not be spending August recruiting and training Sunday school teachers. Instead, we are planning for a online Sunday school opening with the hope of in person learning starting later in the fall. We will continue to wear masks as we gather for service and work to keep our services small to facilitate space and distancing. Some groups will begin meeting in person and others will meet online. Yet, even with these adjustments, one thing remains the same; God is faithful.

He is faithful and we are faithfully blessed. The ability to broadcast services online (most of the time), to build and host VBS and Sunday school through a digital format, to have both in person and remote catechism classes, and online Bible studies has allowed God's Word to enter our homes and be a part of our lives. Our congregation has been motivated by generosity to give abundantly and make sure our budgeted needs are being met, even at a time when the economic future of our nation seems uncertain. We have celebrated baptisms and weddings and grieved with those who are mourning at funerals. God has been faithful to us and he has faithfully blessed his people.

75 years and we are still Faith-fully blessed. This will never change because God will never change. Thanks be to God that his Word endures forever regardless of how the world is changing around us.

- ◇ We are still requesting that masks be worn if you enter the building





## *Notes from Faith Lutheran Church Music!*

Worship is certainly not the same experience that it used to be. The good news is that we are once again able to join together in praise of our loving God and to receive the many gifts that he bestows on His gathered community of believers. Community is the most important word in that last sentence. While we can certainly hear and meditate on the Word at a time and place of our own choosing we miss the mutual encouragement in faith of our fellow believers and we lack the in-person exercising of the pastoral office as a representative of Christ – administering the sacrament of Holy Communion and absolution for our sins.

The staff and church leadership continue to work to make our worship environment as safe as possible. To that end we will continue to practice physical distancing within the church building and to minimize contact with surfaces by leaving doors open as much as is practical and not sharing worship aids (hymnals, bulletins). Unfortunately that also means for the near future we cannot use our gathering spaces in other parts of the building. Even under these trying conditions I have witnessed the great joy it brings to exchange brief hellos and waves on the way into the church and out in the parking lot after the service is over.

You may have noticed that the order of worship has been modified and somewhat abbreviated to facilitate having three services back to back, and in the summer to accommodate the timing of the children's message. The hymns used in worship tend to be shorter and hopefully more familiar and we haven't been using as much sung liturgy. It's hard to sing with a mask on – this is true. Much of the research on this subject suggests that singing poses about the same risk as speaking in full voice. Through all of this you as a congregation have been doing a great job of displaying the same spirit of worship as before, and that is very heartening and encouraging.

In these unusual times it is my goal to try to keep worship as inspirational and edifying as possible. The limitations perhaps seem obvious: We can't crowd people together to sing over extended periods of time. Again, the focus is on fewer sung portions and the more familiar. It will be difficult to assemble the traditional choir under current circumstances, however it is possible to creatively use some soloists and smaller groups to lead worship without creating anxiety for the musicians or worshipers. The same applies to instrumentalists. Wind instruments need to be treated like singers who are unmasked and will be kept at a greater distance from worshipers. Strings, keyboards, handbells and percussion instruments offer opportunities for much variety in the music without as much risk as long as the number of people handling them is kept to a minimum.

For the members of the choirs and other musicians in the congregation it means that we will have to regroup from the rehearsal and worship patterns to which we are accustomed. Regular Tuesday rehearsals will probably be replaced by small sets of musicians who practice at a mutually agreed upon time. And, the personnel of these groups will change from week to week and service to service. While that would seem to be rather limiting, there are many musical resources for smaller groups that we have not fully explored and which present some new and exciting possibilities for use in worship.

It is my prayer for you that as we continue to navigate these usual times that our worship helps each of you to anchor your faith in the traditions of our worshiping community here, whether that means joining us in person or continuing to watch our streamed services from home.
