My favorite chapter transition in Scripture is from Psalm 23 to Psalm 24. Quite often, especially in Psalms, we read the Psalms as independent units and consider them as such. Last summer, however, as I was reading a devotion from Psalms, I had read Psalm 23 and it was fresh in my mind as I started reading Psalm 24, and the beauty of what was revealed not only caught me off guard, but took my breath away.

Psalm 23 ends with the promise that you will "dwell in the house of the Lord forever." It is a wonderful promise that is the fulfillment of what the Good Shepherd offers his sheep; good pasture, still waters, rest, comfort, safety, healing, goodness, and mercy. It is a promise that we rejoice in at every funeral and are reminded of during the Easter season on Good Shepherd Sunday. What caught me off guard was not his promise, but what comes immediately after in Psalm 24:1, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof." Consider the implications of what this teaches. You do not need to wait until death to be in the house of the Lord, you are already there! The whole earth, every last part of it, belongs to the Lord. There is no place that we can be that does not belong to God. Yes, when we die and go to our Father's house where there are many rooms, we will experience something different and far greater than we currently know in this life, however, what we have now is also God's. He is not distant, waiting for us to arrive at his house for a visit. We live in the creation he made, dwell in the creation belongs to him, and we are reminded that he is Immanuel, God with us because he came to earth to dwell and call it his home. Yes, we will dwell in the house of the Lord, but where we dwell now is also his.

As you reflect on 2025 and begin looking to 2026, there are undoubtably blessings to count and sorrows to mourn. Good things and bad. For as long as we live on this earth, both realities will be true. Both will be a part of our experience. But his also is true- God is there for all of it. He is not distant. He is not dis-interested. We live in his creation because we are his creation. So, like a Good Shepherd, he gives you rest, comfort, safety, binds your wounds, and follows you with goodness and mercy. He is present with you because "all the earth is the Lords and the fullness thereof." As you look to the new year, rejoice in knowing that God has promised one day you will see him face to face in his heavenly home. A home where he has a room for you. But in the meantime, where you live now also belongs to God. He knows your name. He has seen your face. He has called you his child. He has promised you shall dwell in his house forever.

May God grant you a blessed and wonderful new year.

#### Adult Bible Study Sun. | 9:15 am Fellowship Hall






#### **COUNCIL OPENINGS**


