April showers bring May flowers. That is the wives' tale wisdom we cling to this time of year. As we see the signs of spring, the promises of what is to come, we need to be reminded that the trek to spring does not happen in a day, but comes, slowly, with the rise and fall of the temperatures, the wetting and drying of mud puddles, and even late season snow fall. The glimpses of spring might be around us, but we know it takes time for spring to finally arrive.

We are roughly half-way through the season of Lent, and we are looking all the more intently at the celebration of Easter. The readings we hear are fervently pointing us to the contemplation of the Lord's Passion. This newsletter is full of information about the Easter celebrations at church. You may even be longing for the breaking of your Lenten fast. As we get ever closer, more and more glimpses of Easter appear around us, but we know it will still take time for Easter to finally arrive.

We practice this waiting for the resurrection every year because it helps us remember who we are as God's children and what it is for which we are waiting. The great Easter, promised to us all, will occur with Christ's return, the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Each celebration of Easter (and every Sunday we gather is meant to be a "little Easter" celebrating Christ's triumph over death), serves as a glimpse of what is to come. Yes, there is an ebb and flow to life, "good" days and "bad" days, high points and low points, but that is because our God is patient and his timeline is not our time line. There may be days when it seems that his return is a long way off, but Easter reminds us that the time is coming, but God is giving time for the fullness of his people to be called his own.

As we wait for that great and final Easter, our task is to look and notice the glimpses of the Easter that is to come. To remind ourselves and one another of what God has already done because it is on his past work that our hope for what he has yet to do is founded. Just as we know spring will finally come, because our experience tells us it always has, we can be certain that Christ is return because he has always kept his promises to his holy people.

Psalm 136 boldly declares this message with the returning refrain, "for his steadfast love endures forever." Twenty-six times, the psalmist states an action of God and then rejoices that the reason God has done this work is because "his steadfast love endures forever." Like the glimpses of spring, and the yearly celebration of Easter, the psalmist is helping us to see the kind of God we have; a God who we can count on, a God who does not change, a God who does not go back on his word, but a God whose "steadfast love endures forever."

Lent is a season in the church year that is characterized by an intensified focus on repentance. True repentance begins and ends with the work of God's Word on the heart, as He crushes sinners with the Law so that he can restore them with the Gospel of Christ Jesus. However, repentance also manifests itself in outward practices.

This Lent, we will take a look at such practices as they appear in the Bible, examining what they teach about our sin as well as our need for a Savior.




Christian Growth Adult Bible Study Sundays at 9:15 am in the Fellowship Hall

Tuesday Morning Bible Study Tuesdays at 9:30 am in the Lounge



Due to the generous gifts given to the Faith Lutheran Church Legacy Endowment Fund in the last couple of years, our congregation is blessed to have a healthy and active endowment. According to our constitution, and the intent of the endowment, the funds it provides are designated for non-budgeted expenditures in our congregation. This means its current intent is to supplement the mission and ministry of our congregation by providing resources to support the day-to-day work of Faith Lutheran Church. Each year, the Church Council and the Voters' Body authorize a 5% withdrawal from the total value of the endowment on January 1 of that year. This year, that amount was \$100,825.04- what an incredible gift to our congregation. A portion of these funds, through the Jerry Delahaut is designated for scholarships to students attending NEW Lutheran High School and is divided among the students who are not eligible for the Wisconsin Parent Choice program. A different portion of the funds has been designated to be used for music and for scholarships to families attending one of the schools in the Lutheran School Association. The remaining amount is undesignated and the Endowment Committee receives proposals about how to use those funds each year.

So far this year, the committee has approved scholarships for children from 1st through 12th grade attending Camp Luther. Families are asked to pay a \$100 deposit, and the Faith Lutheran Legacy Endowment Fund will pay the remaining amount. On April 5, Faith will be hosting Rev. Joel Shaltanis of Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Plano, Texas, to present on the topic "Drafted to be Lutheran." This educational event will include lunch for participants. This, too, is an opportunity made available by the endowment.

As the year continues, the committee will continue to receive proposals for the remaining funds. It is also working with sub-committees to define areas of long-term planning and needs to make sure that it continues to be a good steward of what has been entrusted to our congregation's care. The Faith Lutheran Church Legacy Endowment Fund is a great blessing and we give thanks to the generosity of those who continue to support its growth. If you would like to participate in the continued growth of the fund, you can give through the regular offering by designating the gift to the endowment or a specific fund within the endowment. You can also list the endowment in your estate plan or your Required Minimum Distributions. If you would like more information, please speak to either Pastor or Rod Goldhahn.


