Hospitality is one of those characteristics that can be hard to define but easy to recognize. For example, while it will certainly include great service at a restaurant or a hotel, being great at service doesn't mean that the staff excelled at hospitality. On the other hand, being kind or outgoing doesn't necessarily make someone hospitable either. It is a mix of service, awareness, and compassion that has the ability to change the kind of day or experience you are having by blessing you in an unexpected way.

While some people are naturally inclined toward hospitality because they enjoy being with people and tending to their needs, it is a skill that can also be learned. By emulating those who have given you incredible hospitality, you can begin developing the same habits and affects that allow you to welcome others as well. Like most skills, however, to become good at hospitality, you need to think about it, practice it, and desire to improve.

The season of Epiphany, which begins January 6 and lasts until Ash Wednesday, is the time in the church when we learn who Jesus is. The natural focus following his birth, allows us to hear readings from Scripture that allow us to reflect on who Jesus is in preparation for answering the questions posed by Lent and Easter of why he came to earth and why his coming matters. As we hear the readings of Epiphany, one of the things we learn about Jesus is that he excelled at hospitality and taught his disciples to do the same. While there are many aspects of who Jesus is, this year we are going to focus on his actions of hospitality and why they matter. When you view them in this light, what you learn is that his hospitality ultimately reveals who he is. His hospitality reveals that, not only does he not come to be served but to serve, but he serves because he cares about those he meets.

As followers of Jesus, our task is to reveal Jesus to those we meet. One of the best ways to do this is through the same kind of hospitality he displayed to the people he served. As I mentioned in the opening, it is one thing to serve, hospitality is something entirely different. Hospitality gets to the core of why we serve in the first place, it is to love others the way that we first were loved by God.

During this Epiphany Season, be on the lookout for great examples of hospitality and give thanks when you encounter it. Learn from those experiences and ask how you can apply it within your own life as well. Great hospitality is more than service with a smile; it is service anchored in genuine love and care for your neighbor. It is service focused only on the one who will be blessed by your work.

Voting Member Registry Changes

Based on recommendations from the Board of Elders, the Church Council has approved changes in the development of the Voting Member Registry. The Voting Member Registry is used to identify eligible Voting Members for conducting a Voters Assembly meeting. Due to these changes, the eligibility of Communicant members to vote in a Voters Assembly meeting is potentially affected. Per the church constitution, "Voting members are all active Communicant Members in good standing that have reached 18 years of age." Although the constitution defines the criteria for Communicant membership, it does not define criteria regarding "active" membership or membership "in good standing." To address this, the following definitions have been approved and added to our membership policy:

- Communicant members are considered active when they attend at least one of the available worship services nominally each month or a minimum of twelve (12) worship services within the previous twelve (12) month period. Exceptions are permitted for members that may be unable to attend based on review by the Pastor and Board of Elders. Examples include, but are not limited to, shut-in, college attendance, temporary residence, military service, incarceration, hospitalization, or institutionalization. Adult (age 18 or over) Communicant members shall also have contributed financially to the church on at least an annual basis.
- A member is considered in good standing when they display by their conduct that they sincerely desire to fulfill their membership duties, are not actively in the process of fraternal admonition by the Pastor or Board of Elders, and are not impenitent for the sins in which fraternal admonition was administered.

Members that do not record their attendance at worship or contribute cash without using an assigned envelope, participate in a manner that does not allow us to have a record of participation, Since church records may be incomplete or an error may have occurred in development of the Voting Member Registry, an individual may attest to meeting the required Voting Member criteria and request to be received as a Voting Member at the Voters Assembly Meeting. This is consistent with the church constitution which describes the process for reception of voting members and retains the Voters Assembly as the approval authority of the congregation.

These changes are intended to further clarify and strengthen the determination of voting member eligibility. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these changes, please feel free to contact me or any Elder.

Please leave at least a minimum 1/4 inch of paper on each side of the stamp when cutting it from the envelope.




Let your faith Grow! Bible studies offered at Faith Lutheran Church

The Feast Bible Study 1st Tues. of the Month | 6:30 pm in the Lounge


Join together with other young adult members of the congregation for Bible Study, devotions, fellowship, and food.





Life gets really busy and sometimes, it is tough to prepare dinner for your family. Let the Meal Ministry help with that. On Thursday, January 9, at 5:30 pm, we will be having a meal prep night where we will be making different meal options that can easily be put in the oven or crockpot. Each family participating will be able to have 2 meals to take home and some will be utilized when there is a time where someone doesn't have time to prepare a meal for the Meal Ministry program to give to someone in need. Cost is \$10/family and this include 2 meals that you will be able to bring home to use as you need. There is a sign up near the Fellowship Hall. Please sign up in advanced so we have enough ingredients.

What is the Meal Ministry? The Meal Ministry started as the Meal Storks in 2018 for families who just welcomed a newborn into their family. In 2019, we saw a need to help members of Faith who had surgery, had an emergency in the family, passing of a family member, or are facing some hardship. Today, both of these groups are joined together under the Meal Ministry program. On average, we have coordinated 2-3 meals per week over 3 week stretch (depending on recovery time/needs).
