What are you giving up for Lent? Every year, as we approach this liturgical season, it is the practice of many to relinquish a food or activity for 40 days. Most commonly, Christians give up sugary foods such as chocolate. Others delete social media apps, eliminating the time-wasting temptation to doom scroll through Facebook or X. Still others choose to take up a dense Bible-reading schedule or establish a new prayer routine. They're all practices many Christians take up during Lent. But have you ever thought about why you do them?

All these exercises serve the purpose of teaching repentance. After all, Lent is a penitential season during which we intensify our focus on repentance, on sorrow over sin, and on grief over the damage our transgressions have caused. As we anticipate Jesus' sacrificial death on Good Friday, we remind ourselves that our own wickedness is the reason He had to go to the cross. By giving up small treasures or taking up godly habits, we are led to recognize the weakness of our sinful nature while looking to Christ Jesus for the forgiveness of our sins.

Many of these repentant actions appear in the Bible. God's Word has plenty to say about fasting, prayer, and giving to the poor. The Scriptures reveal that there's catechetical value in taking up these practices. They aren't meaningless customs but rather fruitful habits which help us conform our bodies to the biblical truths we already believe in our hearts and confess with our lips.

There are three primary ways penitential practices teach us about repentance. First, they show us the reality of sin. As we attempt to restrain our desires, we feel the influence of sin over us. Do we fear, love, and trust in God above all things, or do we find our ultimate security in the satisfaction of our appetites? It is not as if the enjoyment of God's gifts is inherently sinful. But when we fast, we are forced to tell our belly, "I will not obey your cravings. You are not God!" As we struggle against our fundamental desires, our idols are exposed before our eyes, and we are reminded of the death our deeds deserve.

Second, external acts of repentance train us to place our full reliance in Christ Jesus. When we fast and pray, we condition ourselves to live out the truth that man does not live by bread alone. While suffering, we learn to cast our trust in the redemptive work of Christ Jesus above all things, knowing that our powers are unable to earn salvation for us. Only the blood of Christ can satisfy the wrath of God and restore us to new life.

Lastly, bodily preparation during Lent can help us lend our members to good works. Having recognized the idols of our hearts, acts of self-discipline can train us to resist possible temptations that may befall us in the future. Not only that, but we can use these practices to show love to our neighbor. The money we save from not splurging on our wants can be given to the poor and needy, as we display the love and mercy Christ Jesus has shown to us in His atoning death on the cross.

This Lent, follow along as we explore penitential practices in the Bible. We will examine them, ponder what the Scriptures say about them, and consider implementing them in Christian freedom. Above all, we will learn to see how each practice inclines our focus, both body and soul, to repentance and faith in our crucified Lord.

Lent is a season in the church year that is characterized by an intensified focus on repentance. True repentance begins and ends with the work of God's Word on the heart, as He crushes sinners with the Law so that he can restore them with the Gospel of Christ Jesus. However, repentance also



Tuesday mornings starting promptly at 6 am and ending at 7 am in the Lounge. Coffee and light breakfast will be provided.




Morning Prayer Tuesdays at 9:00 am in the Sanctuary

Due to the generous gifts given to the Faith Lutheran Church Legacy Endowment Fund in the last couple of years, our congregation is blessed to have a healthy and active endowment. According to our constitution, and the intent of the endowment, the funds it provides are designated for non-budgeted expenditures in our congregation. This means its current intent is to supplement the mission and ministry of our congregation by providing resources to support the day-to-day work of Faith Lutheran Church. Each year, the Church Council and the Voters' Body authorize a 5% withdrawal from the total value of the endowment on January 1 of that year. This year, that amount was \$100,825.04- what an incredible gift to our congregation. A portion of these funds, through the Jerry Delahaut is designated for scholarships to students attending NEW Lutheran High School and is divided among the students who are not eligible for the Wisconsin Parent Choice program. A different portion of the funds has been designated to be used for music and for scholarships to families attending one of the schools in the Lutheran School Association. The remaining amount is undesignated and the Endowment Committee receives proposals about how to use those funds each year.

So far this year, the committee has approved scholarships for children from 1st through 12th grade attending Camp Luther. Families are asked to pay a \$100 deposit, and the Faith Lutheran Legacy Endowment Fund will pay the remaining amount. On April 5, Faith will be hosting Rev. Joel Shaltanis of Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Plano, Texas, to present on the topic "Drafted to be Lutheran." This educational event will include lunch for participants. This, too, is an opportunity made available by the endowment.

As the year continues, the committee will continue to receive proposals for the remaining funds. It is also working with sub-committees to define areas of long-term planning and needs to make sure that it continues to be a good steward of what has been entrusted to our congregation's care. The Faith Lutheran Church Legacy Endowment Fund is a great blessing and we give thanks to the generosity of those who continue to support its growth. If you would like to participate in the continued growth of the fund, you can give through the regular offering by designating the gift to the endowment or a specific fund within the endowment. You can also list the endowment in your estate plan or your Required Minimum Distributions. If you would like more information, please speak to either Pastor or Rod Goldhahn.



While Green Bay Trinity & NEWLHS participate in the choice program, Faith Christian Preschool does not. Even though the preschool is not part of the School Choice program, they do offer tuition assistance. There is also now a FCP scholarship available through the FLCGB Legacy Endowment Fund. Students who attend NEWLHS, and did not qualify for the voucher, are eligible to receive the Delahaut Scholarship from Faith Lutheran Church which helps reduce the cost of tuition.



MISSION

To honor the dignity, restore hope, and create lasting change for those experiencing homelessness or housing instability in the Greater Green Bay community.

ABOUT

In 2022-2023, after months of renovations, the St. John's Ministries opened Green Bay's first women's only shelter of last resort. There are two shelters where both men and women can feel safe, supported, and their dignity honored. Throughout the shelter season, St. John's Ministries safely sheltered and supported 184 women (32 each night) and provided 5,642 bed nights at the Women's Shelter. At the Men's Shelter, 418 men (72 each night) and 12,726 bed nights were provided. At their two seasonal emergency shelters of last resort, they provide adults experiencing homelessness with a safe place to sleep during the harsh winter months. At the Micah Center and Wellspring, our two daytime resource centers, they equip adults experiencing homelessness – as well as community members at-risk – with the tools to achieve self-sufficiency.

2 daytime resource centers

- The Micah Center (resource center at 612 Stuart St.)
- The Wellness Center (Women's resource center at 700 E. Walnut St.)

2 seasonal emergency centers

- St. John's Men's Shelter (411 St. John St.)
- St. John's Women's Shelter (700 E. Walnut St.)

LOCAL NEED

Shelter reports are given each year for the demographics and numbers of who has been impacted by St. John's Ministries. These numbers begin on November 1 and go through April 30. *As of 2/8/2024 St. John's Ministries has sheltered 446 unique individuals experiencing homelessness in our community


