Edith Barth, born Roehl, 84, passed away on June 4, 2025 of natural causes. Edith was born in Berlin, Germany in 1940 and was one of four siblings. She is preceded in her journey to heaven by her mother, Anni, father, Werner, brother, Wolfgang, sister, Karin, Aunt (Tante), Elli, sister-in-law, Margie and her niece, Amanda.

Edith will be remembered for her vibrant energy, spontaneity, determination and love for her family. Edith had a constant desire for self development and improvement, often jokingly telling her adult American born children that, while born in Germany, she had a

broader English vocabulary than them. She liked word games, crypto quote puzzles, crossword puzzles and many more. While not really a book reader, she had a great appetite for periodicals, newspapers and short stories.

She has family on four continents; several across the United States, several in Germany, England, Australia and also in Namibia, Africa.

As a 20+ year cancer survivor, she sought to maintain a healthy lifestyle and was careful with her diet.

Music was her passion and not a day went by without a song in her heart. Edith loved to sing, not only in the kitchen, shower, car and living room, but was a member of the church choir at Faith Lutheran Church, of which she was a member. She enjoyed artists like Tom Jones, especially, as well as Die Flippers, Semino Rossi, Heintje Simons, Peter Alexander and anything performed by her children and Grandson Nathan Barth. Some of her favorite hymns are "Peace like a River", "How Great Thou Art" and "Just as I am". She also liked "My Way" by Frank Sinatra and of course Elvis.

Edith came to the United States in 1959 after living through some of the post World War 2 chaos in Berlin, seeking a better life and in 1960 married Hans E. Barth in Sheboygan, Wisconsin. They have been married for 64 years.

In addition to travel and big family vacations across the US, Edith loved her pets, who she will be joining with in heaven; Cleo, Sadie, Lucky, Buddy, Daisy and Prince. Her life had many obstacles, like cancer and seeing those around her pass away, and her faith carried her through those times.

She also had many exciting times and triumphs, like the time she flew in a helicopter for Mother's Day, the birth and raising of her children Karin (Annette) and Jeff Barth, a chance to travel in the Holy Land, Spain and in 2006 to meet her Grandson, for example.

Edith is survived by her husband Hans, her daughter Annette Karin, her son Jeff, her daughter-in-law Laura, her grandson Nathan, her brother Guenter, sister-in-law Doris and nieces and nephews. In life, she served as an example to all of those around her. In her passing, as in her life, she really did it "Her Way" and when she took her journey to heaven, it WAS well with her soul.
