3. How should the “strong” in faith respond?
4. What role does judgment play within a congregation/what distinction is made between when believers should confront one another or when they should not?
 - a. Clothing or frequency of communion
 - b. Open and unrepentant sin
5. What becomes the most important aspect of the individual’s practice?
6. What comfort does Paul give in the midst of this to those who are living the Christian life in the way they believe to be most faithful?

8. What kind of an account must we give to the Lord?
9. What responsibility do those who are “strong” in the faith have to those around them?
