Building off of the idea that God works through means, Mr. Alex designed a lesson plan that taught how God does this through other people. This got me to thinking about the Church and it reminded me of a Scripture that I then looked up and reread.

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. All the nations will be gathered in his presence, and he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink. I am a stranger and you welcomed me. I was lacking clothes and you clothed me. I was sick and you took care of me. I was in prison and you visited me...Just as you did it for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it for me." - Matthew 25:31-40

When I read Jesus saying, "I was hungry and you gave me food to eat" I am reminded of the large bags of groceries that were sitting in our pantry when we arrived. I am reminded of the homes we were invited to for dinner, and I am reminded of the gift cards we were given during Christmas that allowed us to have a meal out at a restaurant.

When I read Jesus saying, "I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink" I am reminded of the water bill that Faith pays for us every month, and I am reminded of the local soda and wine that congregation members have brought to our home or shared with us over a meal.

When I read Jesus saying, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me" I am reminded of how everyone made us feel when we walked into the Church on that last Sunday of July in 2019. I am reminded of all the people who already knew my wife and kid's names, and I am reminded of the Packers pre-season tickets members gave us that allowed us to go see an NFL game at Lambeau Field.

When I read Jesus saying, "I was lacking clothes and you clothed me" I am reminded of the bags full of clothes from congregation members that were given to my kids. I am reminded of the clerical clothes that the congregation purchased for me and the hand-tailoring and cleaning of my alb provided by a member.

When I read Jesus saying, "I was sick and you took care of me" I am reminded of the time when my family and I were diagnosed with COVID-19, and every day we had a bag placed on our front steps full of stuff to help us get through it. I am reminded of the box of Gluten-Free cupcakes, the bottles of Tylenol, and the giant packs of toilet paper. I am reminded of the food deliveries that arrived at our front door and made it so that we didn't have to worry about supper while we were sick.

I guess what I mean to say is that Faith Lutheran is a wonderful Church that does a good job of demonstrating what it is like to be a follower of Jesus. You would have to be blind not to see that this church is full of sheep. I and my family have learned so much from you and we will always be grateful for our time with you. Please never let the dark forces of this world destroy what you have here, and show this same love and kindness to your new Vicar. From the bottom of our hearts, we will miss each of you. Thank you for everything.

Like so many other things that have been affected by the corona virus, we don't have enough reliable information to say for sure. Since both singing and speaking responses are integral parts of our worship, and have been since they were inherited from pre-Christian times, it is hard to imagine not singing and speaking together as we worship as a community. Yet in these unusual times we have to work with the best information that we have to date. To that end, I would like to share what I have learned as of the end of June.

We know that the virus is spread most readily through inhaling droplets in the air. In that way, it is not unlike other respiratory infections like SARS that have plagued the world in recent years. The countries that have battled those diseases have taught us the value of using masks to reduce the numbers of infections. We also know that the longer a person is in close proximity to someone who is already ill increases the chances of becoming infected. That lesson was learned all too well by the spike in infections right here in Brown County at the meat packing plants. It appears that touching objects is the less likely source of infection, but it is still wise to keep up with frequent hand washing and using hand sanitizer given how easy it is to inadvertently touch your face or a contaminated face mask.

What does all this mean for singing in church? If we apply what we know from experience so far along with guidelines that have been issued by national choral organizations and the CDC we can recommend the following:

- † If we are singing or speaking loudly, we should use face masks. I am personally not fond of them because they make it harder to breath, they fog up my glasses and they muffle the sound of our voices. But they do reduce the amount of aerosols that are emitted by those activities. I should note here that there is still disagreement on how much aerosols spread the virus depending on the size of the water droplets and other factors. For now, masks seem to be a good and useful idea.
- † We should continue to practice physical distancing. Interestingly there isn't even agreement in the scientific community on the safe distance that singers should be apart. I have seen everything from 18 inches on up to 12 feet. Good air flow is also important and we are fortunate to have a larger sanctuary with high ceilings and therefore a larger volume of air. A shorter exposure to one another over time also seem to be helpful. You may have noticed that the services are tending to be more brief with shorter hymns and less sung liturgy.
- † In the near term we will also continue to minimize contact with all surfaces. That's the reason there are no items left in the pews. It is possible that we may start using the hymnals again if enough time can elapse between uses. (We have enough for each person to use one each week.)

Thank you for your patience as we continue to search for the best ways to navigate these strange times in the life of the church. And, thank you for participating in such a heartfelt way since we have been allowed to return to worship. Your voices are coming through loud and clear, and by doing so you are encouraging the faith of everyone gathered together again.



While Vacation Bible School went virtual this year, there is no doubt that the children (and adults) had fun with the different activities for each day's lesson. We focused on how food, water, shelter, health, and life are Essential... but most importantly, that Jesus is Essential!
