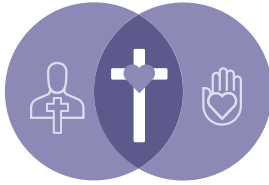


## A SIGN AND A PROMISE

### SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

God reassures Abram of His promise to bless the earth through Abram's offspring. God changes his name from Abram ("exalted father") to Abraham ("father of many nations") and institutes circumcision as the sign of His continued covenant with Abraham. Despite Abraham and Sarah's advanced age, God promises they will have a son of their own.

### TAKING IT HOME

- ▶ *On the Go*—Why did God rename Abram and Sarai? When did God give you a new name?
- ▶ *At Meal Time*—God promised Abram that all people would be blessed through him. He kept His promise by sending His Son, Jesus. What did Jesus do that provides blessings for all people?
- ▶ *Something to Do*—Abram was ninety-nine years old when God changed his name to Abraham. He also changed his wife's name from Sarai to Sarah. He promised that even in their old age, they would have a son. Read Genesis 17:19. Who named their child? Find out who named you.
- ▶ *Before Bed*—Look at the night sky outside your bedroom window. How many stars can you see? Can you count them? Though we can't always see them, the endless stars remind us of God's endless love for us.
