CONNECTING IDENTITY & CALLING

IDENTITY: WHO AM I?

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

Falsely accused, Joseph finds himself in prison interpreting dreams for Pharaoh's baker and cupbearer. When the Egyptian pharaoh has troubling dreams, God empowers Joseph to explain the visions. Pharaoh appoints him to the second highest position in the land, and Joseph manages the harvest to endure the coming famine.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—How did God help Joseph through his troubles? How does God help you in tough situations?
- At Meal Time—The evil thoughts Joseph's brothers had led them to evil actions.
 Why does this happen? Read Matthew
 15:19. Where do evil thoughts come from? Reuben, the oldest brother, interceded for (tried to help and protect) Joseph. Who intercedes for us when we sin?
- Something to Do—Write Romans 8:28 on a piece of paper and decorate it together with different colored borders, rejoicing that God works for our good just as He worked good for Joseph.
- Before Bed—Explain the connection between the story of Joseph and God's promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob that through their offspring all nations would be blessed.
