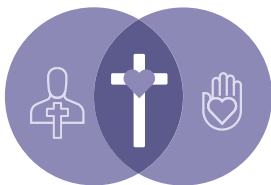

CONNECTING IDENTITY & CALLING

IDENTITY: WHO AM I?

God has sent His own Son as the Passover Lamb, who shed His blood to cover my sins.

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

God, through Moses, threatens one final plague—worse than any previously experienced. Following God's instructions, the Israelites make careful preparations for the Passover, marking their doorposts with the blood of a lamb prepared for the feast. The final plague takes place at midnight as all the firstborn throughout Egypt die. The Egyptians hand over their valuables, hastening the Israelites away.

TAKING IT HOME

- ▶ *On the Go*—What was the final plague God sent to Egypt? Why did God send this plague? How did God allow His people to protect themselves?
- ▶ *At Meal Time*—What food did God command the Israelites to prepare on the night of the tenth plague? Why was this special meal called “the Passover”?
- ▶ *Something to Do*—Search online for pictures of a Passover meal. Which foods are bitter? salty? sweet?
- ▶ *Before Bed*—The blood of the lamb on the doorpost was a sign that the Israelites were protected from death. In an earlier story, God sent a ram for Abraham to sacrifice instead of his son Isaac. Whose blood has saved you from death?
