CONNECTING IDENTITY & CALLING

IDENTITY: WHO AM I?

God fulfilled His promise to send a Savior: His Son, Jesus Christ.

CALLING: WHY AM I HERE?

I am God's chosen servant, enabled to serve Him by serving others in His name.

GROWING IN FAITH FOR LIFE

ADULT

I can summarize how prophecies in Isaiah point to Jesus as Savior of mankind from sin, death, and the devil.

YOUTH

I can explain how Jesus fulfilled God's promise of a Savior.

ELEMENTARY

I understand that God promised to send a Savior, and that Savior was Jesus.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

I know Jesus is the Savior God promised to send.

By His wounds you have been healed.

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

In an amazing vision of the Lord in glory upon His throne in heaven, God asks Isaiah, "Whom shall I send?" Isaiah responds, "Here I am! Send me" (Isaiah 6:8). Isaiah's prophecies extend beyond the destruction and captivity of Judah to the extensive details concerning the coming of the Messiah and His sacrifice for the salvation of His people.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—Why was Isaiah afraid to be in God's presence? What did the angel do? How have your sins been covered so that you can be in God's presence?
- At Mealtime—Talk about how each of Isaiah's prophecies in today's reading was fulfilled.
- Something to Do—Find hymns or songs that use Isaiah's words. Memorize a verse or two from your favorite hymn and sing it to praise and thank God for atoning for your sins.
- Before Bed—God's people had turned away from Him and were worshiping idols. Talk about things we make into idols today. How does God feel when we love idols more than we love Him? Pray together, asking God to help you repent, turn away from your idols, and honor Him as the one true God.
