CONNECTING IDENTITY & CALLING

IDENTITY: WHO AM I?

God's Word and Sacraments point me toward my Savior.

CALLING: WHY AM I HERE?

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

John the Baptist lives in the wilderness, dressed in camel's hair and eating locusts and honey. John's message of repentance and preparation draws people to the banks of the Jordan, where they receive Baptism. As the prophet sent to point out the Messiah, John declares, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29), as Jesus approaches. When John baptizes Jesus in the Jordan, the Spirit descends on Him as the voice of the Father proclaims, "This is My beloved Son" (Matthew 3:17).

TAKING IT HOME

- ▶ On the Go—John pointed the way to Jesus, the Lamb of God. As you ride in the car, look for signs that have arrows on them. To what are the arrows pointing? Do any of them point to churches?
- ➤ At Mealtime—Talk about how the three persons of the Trinity are each clearly present at Jesus' Baptism.
- ▶ Something to Do—John the Baptist ate honey while he lived in the wilderness. Spread honey on crackers for a snack. Do you think you could survive on honey in the wilderness? Who was with John while he was out preaching? How is God with you too?
- ▶ Before Bed—Jesus told John that His Baptism would "fulfill all righteousness," which means that it was part of God's will. What are some other ways Jesus would fulfill all righteousness? In your Baptism, Jesus' righteousness became your righteousness before God.
