Fire Alarm Installation As Needed

We have helped over 115 homes with 332 alarms!

Why Being involved makes a difference.

During a recent alarm installation, the installation became secondary. Red Cross volunteers, Kathy Zellers and Brenda Clark, were in the county at the end of a road. They were there to install a bed shaker alarm for a deaf child. When they arrived, they learned that the child's mother was also deaf. Entering the home, they heard alarms going off. No one in the home knew about the alarms because they couldn't hear them. They were carbon monoxide alarms. 911 was called. The fire department responded and confirmed the gas readings. The family and their pets were not able to return to the house. Luckily there were relatives nearby who took the family in. All were safe. Thank heavens Kathy and Brenda went to the family's house first and not last on their list. It goes to show that reaching out can SAVE LIVES.

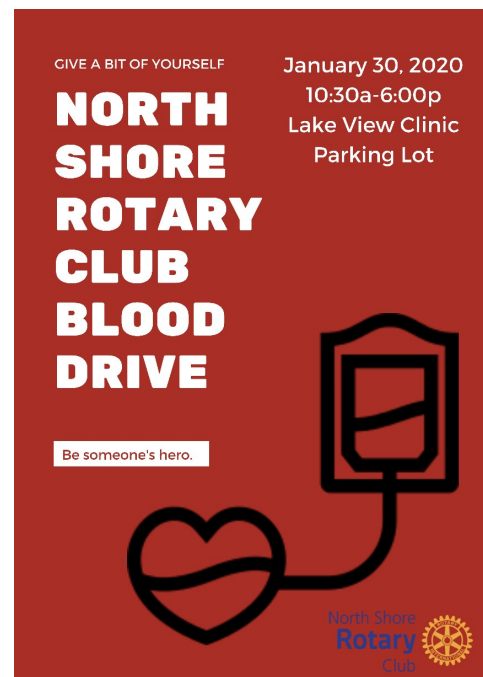
