

3 Days of Wonder are an award winning South Devon based rock band, writing edgy, anthemic songs with an 80's vibe. They combine influences including Foo Fighters, The Police, U2 and The Script.

Their lyrics have clear social commentary, which the band translate into confident, energetic and powerful live performances. Notable gigs include The Fleece (Bristol), Exeter Phoenix, The Junction (Plymouth), The Palladium Club (Bideford) and SOLD OUT shows at The Barrelhouse (Totnes) including a Music Venue Trust fundraiser.

To date, they have been awarded Best New Artist 2025 by the Devon Music Awards, BOTB Exeter Wildcard Winners 2025, Best Artist 2024 by Powderham Live! and Best Newcomer 2023 by Smart Radio 101.
