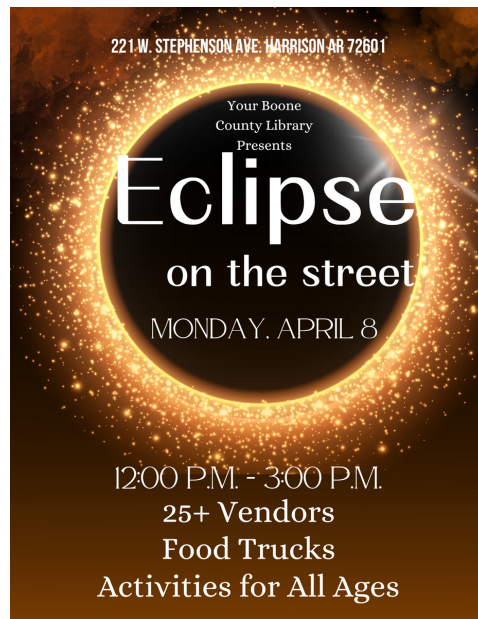

We will be giving out Eclipse Bookmarks until after the Eclipse. Get yours while supplies last. Remember to collect all 5 bookmarks to receive a free gift.

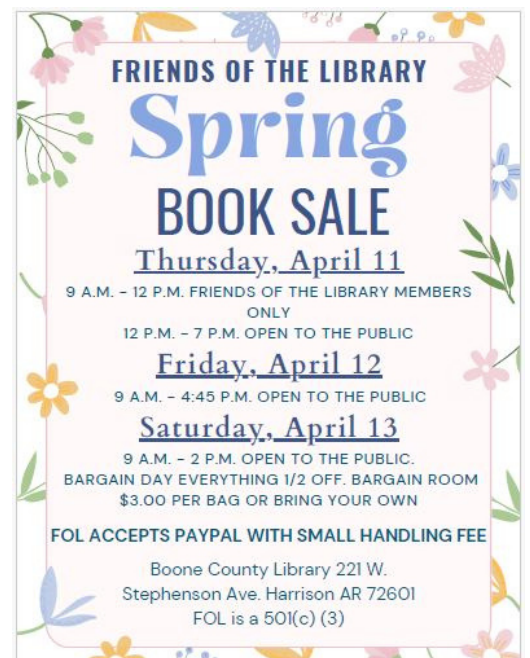

Join us in the children's department to celebrate our special library elf Dewey's birthday! We will sing happy birthday and each child can take a cupcake home.



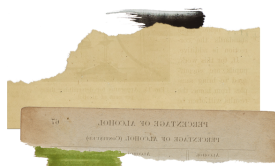
