



# Genealogy

After the implementation of the Flood Act of 1938. The U.S. Army Corps of engineers constructed dams on the White River watershed. By 1946 plans were being made for the construction of Beaver, Table Rock, and Bull Shoals dams. Before the Bull Shoals Dam could be completed, the town of Lead Hill would have to be relocated.

In October 1948 the town council and Mayor Buck Green signed Ordinance No. 26 provided that the town would be moved. Farm lands were condemned and cemeteries were removed. Crews were hired to exhume and relocate human remains from the Milam Cemetery to the New Milam Cemetery.

During the move of the town of Lead Hill many structures were destroyed such as the stores on the main street, a church, cotton gin, and homes. There were approximately 100 buildings to be moved. President Harry S. Truman dedicated the Bull Shoals Dam in July 1952. Below are photos of the old town Lead Hill.
