Everton, Arkansas Incorporated 1913

The Missouri & North Arkansas Railroad was built through Boone County at the beginning of the twentieth century. Everton was one of many new communities that sprung to life during the railroad era. The railroad depot and post office were both established in 1902.

By 1915, the town had four general stores, a bank, hardware store, drugstore, two flour mills, and two hotels. A corn cob pipe factory opened in 1923, by the end of the 1930's the factory was producing 6,000 pipes per day. The factory paid farmers thirty cents per pound for shelled corn cobs and twenty-five cents per pound for the corn. The Works Progress Administration (WPA) constructed a new school for students in 1939.

The 1940's was a difficult decade for the small town. In December 1942 a fire originated in Pete Dahlman Grocery Store destroying a garage, barbershop, produce & feed store, and two unoccupied buildings. A second fire in 1944 started in a room attached to the post office thus destroying a grocery store, restaurant, general store, barbershop, and feed store. By the end of the decade the school was consolidated with Valley Springs and Bellefonte school districts. The local Methodist congregation purchased the school building.

As of the 2020 U.S. Federal Census 104 residents call Everton, Arkansas home. In 2005 a new community center was built in a design to resemble a railroad depot.
