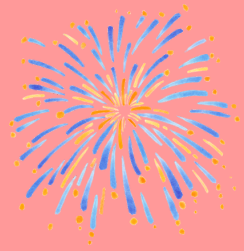

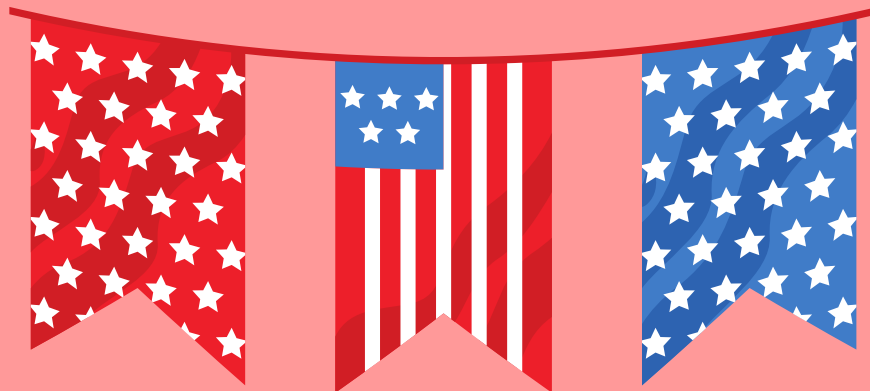

# Genealogy

## RESEARCHING AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIERS

This article concludes our four-part series commemorating 250 years of American independence. In previous issues, we explored how the Revolutionary War began, examined its leaders, and highlighted the important roles of African Americans, Native Americans, and women. Our final topic focuses on how to research American Revolutionary War soldiers. Because of limited time and space, our focus has remained on those who served the cause of American independence rather than British loyalist forces.

For those researching ancestors who served in the Revolutionary War- **Pension files and Bounty Land Warrant files** are valuable resources. These records provide proof of service and can give details of the soldier's families.

What You Can Find in Pension Files:

**Revolutionary War Pension Files**- applications may contain a wealth of information, including:

- Military Service – Unit name, rank, length of service, and sometimes accounts of battles or campaigns
- Vital Records – Birth dates and locations, residences, marriage details, and death information
- Family Details – Names of children under age 16, widows' maiden names, and family relationships
- Supporting Documents – Affidavits from fellow soldiers, discharge papers, payment records, and personal statements describing wartime experiences

**Bounty Land** - land issued to soldiers as compensation for their service. Bounty Land Warrant files can confirm military participation and often document a veteran's post-war migration and settlement. Together, these records help transform Revolutionary War soldiers from names on a list into real people with stories of their lives experience.

Information often found in these records includes:

- Veteran Identification: Full name, rank, company, and regiment.
- Service Details: Length of service, dates of service, and sometimes specific battles or locations.
- Family Information: If applied for by a widow, the records often include her maiden name, marriage date/place, and the date of the veteran's death.

Land Details: The amount of land acreage (which ranged from 100 acres for privates to 1,100 for major generals) and the location of the land.

Assignments: Information indicating if the veteran sold or assigned their warrant to someone else (a common practice).

Supporting Evidence: Applications may contain affidavits, birth records, marriage certificates, or death certificates, often found within federal pension files

Researchers interested in obtaining copies of a Patriot's service records may request them directly from the National Archives. Orders can be placed online by visiting: <https://www.archives.gov/research>  
Records may also be requested by mail using NATF Form 85, titled "National Archives Order for Copies of Federal Pension or Bounty Land Warrant Applications." Please note that the National Archives charges fees for copying and processing pension and bounty land warrant records.
