March 16th-Leprechaun Gardens-Lets lure the lucky ones and make a leprechaun garden to give us some good luck!






March 23rd-Recycled Mini Bird Houses-Have some plastic bottles lying around? I know we do, let's make the birds some colorful homes!

The Capps House South Pine Street Harrison, Arkansas

Charles W. Capps and Dennie Parker were married in 1901. Five children were born to this union: Berry, Parker, Bonnie, Bill, and Scott. The Capps purchased this house in 1909 from W.H. McMillin. Their last two children were born in this home. The home was the location of many social events including the wedding of Bonnie Capps to Fred Ames. Serious events occurred there as well; two surgeries were performed at this home. One by Dr. Leonidas Kirby and another by Doctors Leonidas and Frank Kirby. If this old house could talk the stories it would tell.
