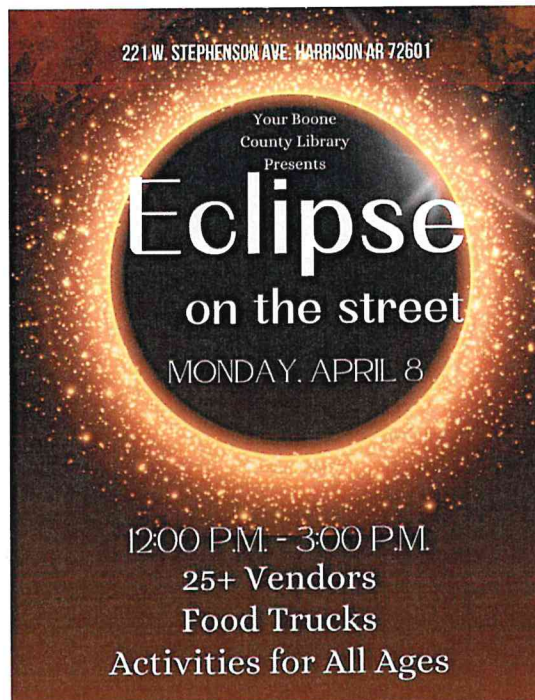

3/5- Pinch Pots Part I- Join us for our two-part clay projects where we make some cute little pinch pots!

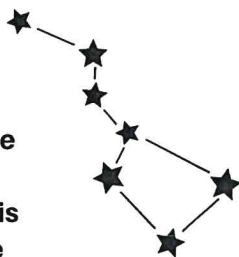
3/12- Pinch Pots Part II- Join us to paint our pinch pots from the week prior. You must have attended the first program in order to participate in the this one.

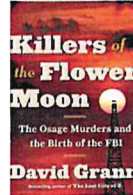
Puzzle for Prize - Word Search

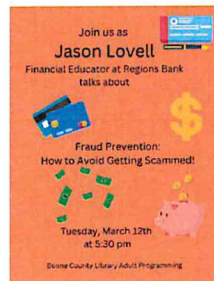
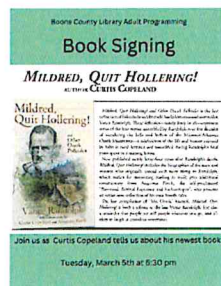

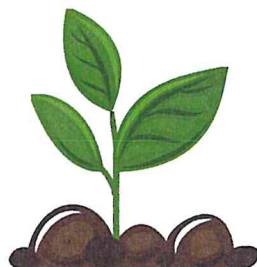

Hopalong Cassidy Savings Club

Hopalong Cassidy is a fictional cowboy hero created in 1904 by Clarence E. Mulford. Mulford wrote a series of popular short stories and novels featuring Hopalong Cassidy. In 1935, the first of sixty-six movies, starring actor William Boyd, was produced transforming the stories into a popular film series.

As Boyd's career grew he recognized the importance of family values and good citizenship. In 1950, Boyd began the Hopalong Cassidy Savings Club a promotional for local community banks. The savings club was designed to encourage youth in learning financial responsibility. Banks across the nation soon joined the campaign and Security Bank in Harrison, Arkansas was no exception. The new club member would receive a Hopalong Cassidy Bank, Savings Rodeo Badge, an autographed color photo, personal letter from Hopalong, Membership Certificate, Membership Card, Club Savings Pass Book, and a Mail Pouch. In the kit was a very important pledge for clean living, good citizenship, and a pledge to earn your own way while saving what you earned.
