




# Tech Tip

We love our Baofeng radios, right? Well, most of us do. Where do you keep your radio when on a run? No space in the console? No console at all? In one of your cup holder...where is goes back and forth when you're going through those twisties? Stuck onto something in the cockpit with Velcro?

Well, having tried most of those ideas, I think I found a simple, yet very convenient place for the radio, no Velcro,



Simply use a strap or even a simple belt wrapped around your head rest. When using a headphone or ear piece, the cord under or over your shoulder works great! When you stop at that frequent pit stop, simply put your ear piece down around your shift lever and get out. No unwinding around yourself, easy peasy!

As you can see, it's a very simple and handy solution!

### What does the NAs, NBs, NCs, NDs designations signify?



If you are like me, when you came into the Bluebonnet Miata Club, you may have been mystified by all the talk was about the various Miata models, i.e., NA, NB, NC, and ND. So, I decided to do a little research.

The letters (N + A, B, C, or D) refer to two letters in the US Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). They are Mazdas so the VIN starts with JM1. The N for the model (Miata) and the letters A, B, C, and stand for each production revision. If you haven't done it, look at the VIN in your Miata to confirm your model.

For you techno's, here is some basic info on the four production models:

#### The NA (1989-1998)

Engine – 1.6L, inline 4-cylinder, 116 hp Transmission – 5-speed manual

Weight - 2070 lbs

0 to 60 - 8.1 seconds, 126 mph top speed

#### The NB (1999-2005)

Engine – 1.8L, incline 4-cylinder, 140 hp

Transmission – 5-speed manual, optional 4-speed automatic

Weight - 2348 lbs

0 to 60 - 7.7 seconds, 130 mph top speed

### The NC (2006-2015)

Engine – 16 valve 2.0L, incline 4-cylinder, 170 hp

Transmission – 6-speed manual, optional 6-speed automatic

Weight - 2542 lbs

0 to 60 - 8.1 seconds, 124 mph top speed

### The ND (2016-20??)

Engine – 2.0L, SKYACTIVE 4-cylinder, 184 hp

Transmission – 6-speed manual, optional 6-speed automatic

Weight - 2341 lbs

0 to 60 - 5.7 seconds, 143 mph top speed

Now for a little Mazda history I picked up in my research. In 1976 Kenichi Yamamoto head of Research and development at Mazda asked Bob Hall, a journalist at Motor Trend, a specialist in the Japanese auto market, "what kind of car Mazda should build for America?" His response was a "simple, bugs-in-the-teeth, wind-in-the-hair, classically-British sports car that doesn't exist anymore."

In 1982, Hall, now working for Mazda, submitted a concept idea to the home office for consideration of such a vehicle. A design competition was held between the Japanese and the California crews, and the California teams won and started designing a new, in expensive British style roadster with Japanese reliability and philosophy. The credo was "oneness of horse and rider." The first model, the MX-5 (designated NA), achieved that objective and has carried it through the later revisions.

One description I was drawn to on the Miata's success at "oneness of horse and rider" was: "This is a car that you don't so much drive as wear it. When you slide into the driver's seat and your butt is nine inches above the pavement, it feels like slipping into your favorite party clothes. Because you are sitting lower than anything else on the road, your perspective changes and no matter how many times you do it, there is always a sense of adventure."

Viva, Miata!
