2026 Next-Gen Mazda MX-5 Miata: It Will Be Electrified



Mazda has confirmed the next-generation 2026 MX-5 Miata will be electrified. But the automaker stopped short of saying what form the electrification will take—fully EV, hybrid, or plug-in hybrid. Mazda's entire lineup is slated to go at least partially electric by 2030, which means if the next-gen Miata is to survive past then—and we certainly hope it does—this is a necessary step in the legendary sports car's evolution.

The Mazda Miata has a long, well-earned reputation as a fun, affordable roadster with fantastic driving dynamics, and an electrified model would keep it viable well into the future. With Mazda taking its time to develop EVs, the Japanese automaker will likely introduce a hybrid or plug-in hybrid Miata before developing an all-electric variant. Mazda's Vision Study Model, a stunning sports car shown at the end of last year, could be a preview to the electric Miata, though it's more likely to simply donate stylistic influences to the production car.

Mazda said it will work with Rohm Co. to develop electric powertrains, and it signed an agreement with Envision AESC to develop batteries. Although these contracts could impact the next-generation Miata, a hybrid version of the roadster makes more sense. The Miata's small footprint could make it difficult to package a battery with sufficient range, as the heavy battery pack would hurt performance, and pure EV hardware would likely mean a large hike in price. Mazda could also work with another automaker to develop the platform, splitting its costs to keep the car affordable à la BMW Z4 and Toyota Supra.

Mazda will attempt to hold the line on keeping the Miata from becoming too expensive, but given the advanced powertrain and other enhancements, a price in the neighborhood of \$33,000 seems reasonable.

We believe we'll see the next MX-5 in time for the summer of 2025 top-down driving season as a 2026 model year vehicle.


Will Miata ever have a Wankel rotary engine? By OpEd Polansky



During my recent perusing of various car mag websites, I ran across this question: "Will Mazda ever make a MX-5 Miata with a rotary engine?" The responding answer to the question got me to do some looking back at Mazda's rotary's history.

I found that it is possible that without the rotary engine, there would probably be no Mazda. And without Mazda, the rotary engine may not have been in production for nearly 50 years. It was Mazda's engineers who took the German inventor Felix Wankel's unique engine design concept to fruition. The first rotary car for sale was the 1964 NSU Spider. Rotary engines were continuously fitted in cars until 2012 when Mazda discontinued its RX-8.

When Mazda unveiled the Cosmo (called the 110S for export) in 1967, it became the first company to sell a mass-produced car with a twin-rotor rotary engine. The highly



lauded, rotary-powered Cosmo Sport not only cemented Mazda's reputation as an highly influential carmaker, but guaranteed the company a permanent place in the automotive world outside of Japan. The engine's small size allowed Cosmo a very aerodynamic design. By the way, today a decent Cosmo is highly sought-after, having reached prices near \$100,000. Starting with the Cosmo, Mazda has bult more than two million rotary-powered cars.

Why is a rotary engine popular? A rotary engine is smaller and lighter than a conventional piston engine, with a superior power-to-weight ratio. As it has no reciprocating parts, just a three-sided rotor spinning in a housing, it is quieter and smoother running. Unlike Piston engines, rotaries are almost immune to catastrophic failure. In a piston motor, you can have a piston seize and cause all kinds of damage, but in a rotary motor, while the engine will lose power, it will continue to produce a limited amount of power until it finally dies.

Why has the rotary engine seen limited success? Despite its advantages, the drawbacks are that it burns oil, has low gas mileage, and emissions problems. Mazda's rotary engines have been known for needing frequent repairs. The seals responsible for maintaining compression in the combustion chamber tended to only last for 80,000 miles or so. And when they go bad, it will likely need an engine rebuild.

In conclusion, my personal answer to the above question is that since Mazda has a long history of using rotary engines in their vehicles, one should not rule out the possibility of Mazda putting a rotary engine in a future MX-5 Miata. For example, it's possible the rotary design being a range extender https://www.insidemazda.co.uk/2018/10/03/mazda-rotary-engine-to-return-as-ev-range-extender/ for Mazda's future EV models of the MX-5.

Great burgers and as you can see, great folks! Thanks everyone for coming out!






