What does history tell us about when we might see the next Miata generation?

I own a 2017 ND and I've begun to wonder about when there might be a fifth generation of the Miata (MX-5). I asked the editor of the Bluebonnet Miata Club Newsletter when he thought that might be the case. He said go do some research and write an article (big help he was!). Anyway, that's what I did and consulted Wikipedia, which you know is always correct and found the following interesting facts.

The first-generation MX-5 (NA) was introduced in 1989 and was in production until 1997. Upon its release, the car won Automobile Magazine and 1990 Automobile Magazine Car of the Year. The MX-5 featured pop-up headlights, unique to the NA model. To keep the weight and price down, base models were not equipped with power steering, air conditioning, a sound system, and had steel wheels. A five-speed manual transmission was standard, with the choice of a four-speed automatic also available.

The second-generation MX-5 (NB) came off the production lines in 1997 and being put on sale in 1998 for the 1999 model year. While it kept the same proportions of its predecessor, its most noticeable change was the removal of the retractable headlamps which were eliminated in the face of more stringent pedestrian safety<https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Pedestrian_safety_through_vehicle_design> requirements. While various special editions continued to be introduced throughout the entire NB production run, the Mazdaspeed MX-5 is distinctive for being the only MX-5 to be turbocharged at the factory. Other Mazdaspeed specs include stiffer and shorter springs, Bilstein shocks, and larger 17-inch wheels.

The third-generation Mazda MX-5 (NC) was introduced in 2005 and was in production until 2015. This generation introduced Power Retractable Hard Top, which featured a folding hard top mechanism that retained adequate trunk space. During its release, the third generation MX-5 received several accolades such as the 2005-2006 Car of the Year Japan https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Car_of_the_Year_Japan Award and Car and Driver's 10Best list from 2006 to 2013.


The fourth-generation Mazda MX-5 (ND) was unveiled in 2014 and has been in production since 2015. An updated model was introduced in 2019, visually identical to the pre-update model, but the engine was upgraded, and a beefed-up flywheel introduced to the powertrain in the manual transmission. The ND generation introduced a Retractable Fastback, an option that features a rigid roof that gave it a coupé-like appearance. The ND has received several accolades including the 2015-2016 Car of the Year Japan Award, the 2016 World Car of the Year Award, Car and Driver's 10Best list from 2016 to 2019, and the Red Dot Best of the Best Award in Product Design 2017. Incidentally, the car is the basis for the Fiat 124 Spider (called by Miata folk, the "Fiata"). So, it appears that each generation is in production for approximately 9-10 years. If that trend continues, expect the next generation to be introduced in the next year or so. Stay tuned!
