Hello BBMC!



Camped out at Louise Hays city park (now a state park), I enjoyed the peaceful beautiful area around Kerrville, Hunt and yes, drove by the many summer camps for young people everywhere.

Recently, I joined up with the Houston Miata Club in Ellinger at Hruska's and the place was packed with dozens of young adults on their way to be camp directors at yes, you guessed it, the hill country camps, including Camp Mystic. This camp was the hardest hit camp during the horrifying flooding causing more deaths that I care to count. I can't help but to think many of those young people I chatted with at Hruska's were lost in that tragic event. I pray they were found safe and sound.

So, I am saddened about that entire event that has taken so many lives. And nicer young people I've never met. God grace to all of them.

Did You Know that BBMC Now Has a Run Committee?



Recently, the BBMC Board authorized the formation of a Run Committee. As agreed to by the Board, the objectives of the Committee are to:

- Recruit new run Leaders (and Relays, and Sweeps),
- Provide support and training for new and prior Leaders
- Maintain a single inventory of past run routes to be available to the Leaders,
- Encourage the scheduling of a minimum of 2 runs every month,
 Educate Leaders (as well as Relays, and Sweeps) and Club members of proper driving, run, and automobile safety matters.

I'm pleased to have been appointed Chair of a great Run Committee with lots of run experience, including Ed Smith, Rohm Thompson, George Lucas, Mark Hungerman, Jim Voss, and Gwen Mitchel, as the Board liaison. We have met twice and started working on the objectives as noted below.

- We have started contacting past run Leaders to ask them to add Runs to the calendar for 2025. The Committee is on its way to having 2 local Runs a month during the remainder of this year.
- We have agreed on the development of a Run Committee pamphlet to provide overall guidance and information about various matters the Committee is dealing with, including information on Leader Tips, Glossary of Miata Radio terms, Run Planning Tips, and run venues.
- We are working on ways to encourage new Run Leaders to lead runs. To that end, we will be developing training sessions to help the new Leaders gain the confidence to lead a run. We will also provide guidance on the responsibilities of the Run Relays and Sweeps, who have important roles in the Runs.
 - We plan to encourage a variety in runs, such as: a shorter than usual run (e.g., to the Luner Zoomer dinner); sunrise or sunset runs (to beat the heat of the summer); taillight run (where the followers don't know where the Run is going); and destination runs (breakfast, lunch, or dinner).

So, if you have any questions or have an interest in pursuing the opportunity to lead a run give a Committee member a call. It's like playing when you design and lead a run of such a fun group happy BBMC members who love to get out on the road in their Miata roadsters. Remember that old George Bernard Shaw quote: "We don't stop playing because we grow old; we grow old because we stop playing."

Editors Note: This effort is designed to keep the Bluebonnet Miata Club thriving. While we are certainly a social club as well as a car club, it'll all be for naught if we don't cultivate these above notes. Long Live BBMC!!!






