What are some special scenic drives near San Antonio?

Ralph Waldo Emerson once said, "It's not the destination, it's the journey." And, in my opinion, the best way to go on a journey is in a Miata. We don't really need a destination, but we need a journey. That made me think it might be worthwhile to point out some of the special scenic journeys that can be found within a short distance from San Antonio. Here are a few suggested journeys.

Marble Falls to Inks Lake

It's a 25-mile paved route passing by several Colorado River lakes and the Longhorn Cavern. Beginning in Marble Falls junction of 281 and RM 1431, go north on 281. After about 8 miles, turn left onto Park Road 4. The road travels west onto Backbone Ridge with view of the river valley and leads up to Inks Lake State Park. Per Mark Hungerman, you might want to continue past Inks Lake, staying on PR 4 up to 29 for a "killer drive" as he puts it.

Willow City Loop

A 22-mile paved route through a rugged area of the Hill Country noted for its spring wildflowers. By the way, George Lucas leads an annual bluebonnet run on the Loop. Start the drive heading north from Fredericksburg on TX 16 about 14 miles to RM1323. It makes a full loop and returns to RM 1323.

Comfort to Luckenbach

A 23-mile paved drive from the town of Comfort (supposedly named because it was the first comfortable place after a difficult trip from New Braunfels) to country music fame village of Luckenbach. The drive begins in Comfort and heads east on RM 473, then turns onto Old No. 9 Highway and passes by the Old Tunnel Wildlife Management Area and home of the famous bat cave. Then you turn right on Grapetown Road which leads to a right turn on RM 1376, a short distance from Luckenbach.

San Marcos to Guadalupe River State Park

A 53-mile road from springs of San Marcos to the white water of the Guadalupe River. Beginning in San Marcos, you travel west on RM 12, which turns into RM 32 (called the Devil's Backbone), a left on FM 3424, and right on FM 306 (passed Canyon Lake), left on US 281, right on 46, and finally a right on PR 31 to the State Park (and Honey Creek State Natural Area).

Kerrville to Lost Maples State Natural Area

A 49-mile drive along upper Guadalupe River. Leaving Kerrville on 27, turn left on 39 at Ingram and you will pass through Hunt on way to a left turn on RM 187 that takes your to Lost Maples. The name of the park comes from the maples having retreated due to climate changes to only isolated pockets where they have extra shade and moisture.

These are just a few of nearby journeys to go on in your Miata. Despite the heat and the resulting paucity of BBMC runs at this time of year, don't let that keep you from getting "on the road again" (as Willie sings). Get out and enjoy the Hill Country with your own DIY run.

Stan and Betty Chambers, Mark Hungerman, and Paul Wilson joined 1,113 registered Miatas and 1,670 registered enthusiasts who attended the 27^{th} Miatas at the Gap [*MATG*] gathering between August 3^{rd} and 6^{th} . Many non-registrants also joined in the festivities for all or part of the event.

For those who are unfamiliar, *MATG* is an annual event that centers around Hwy 129, aptly nicknamed the *Tail of the Dragon*. The *Dragon* writhes over 11 miles and 318 curves between South Carolina and into Tennessee. Numerous challenging and entertaining nearby roads easily accommodate the assembled Miataphiles.

Miatas from across the United States gather at the *MATG* base of operations, the Fontana Village Resort. Those who attended the *Dark Dragon* event to witness the 2017 total eclipse will recall that we stayed at Fontana Village.

Multiple vendors have a strong presence with Miata merchandise to satisfy most any need or want. Enthusiasts of all car and human generations mingle and share with an infectious camaraderie. The baseball field used for the Saturday group photo filled after accepting a mere 20% of the cars that were in attendance.

Stan, Mark, and I mustered at the *Deal's Gap Motorcycle Resort* before dawn each morning. The Motorcycle Resort is less than a mile from the beginning of the *Dragon*. As soon as the sun edged over the horizon, off we scurried between trees, sheer drop-offs, and rocky soil walls. Never encountering traffic ahead of us, we zoomed through the numerous hairpins, switchbacks, and challenging off-camber curves. Our grins were permanently plastered on our faces as we concentrated on the road ahead.

Following a brief break at the large turn-out just across the Tennessee border, we drove the 11-mile return through the *Dragon* to the Motorcycle Resort. Breakfast at *The Dragon's Den* followed. I can highly recommend the *Dragon Slayer* as a tasty and filling reward for successfully remaining on the black stuff between the trees, walls, and drop-offs.

Stan found and adapted a *technical run* prepared for sport motorcycles that we enjoyed for the remainder of the day on Friday. The Saturday afternoon run was marred by an accident on the *Dragon* that slowed our drive to another area. We managed to have a Pineapple Whip [think *Dole Whip*] just outside of Robbinsville, NC on both afternoons; a cool treat that can't be missed.


