We also have a unique problem here in New Braunfels that tourists are continuing to visit and then get tested here in NB before going back home. So, we get the call that someone infected came in and we all had to get negative test results before returning to work. Turns out we were not good. Just last week I received



my Explanation of Benefits for my test I was required to take in order to return to work. Any guesses on what the test alone cost? I'm gonna go ahead and spoil it. Just the test and sending it off to the lab was \$1,700. The visit itself was another \$800. After insurance which I was lucky enough to have cover as if my test was in network, my Explanation of Benefits still had me responsible for around \$1,300. Luckily, the ER I went to has provided written documentation they will not be pursuing the portion not paid by insurance. Others may not be so lucky. Hopefully this is a cautionary tale, avoid needing a test and stay healthy!



Our Evening Miata Run










