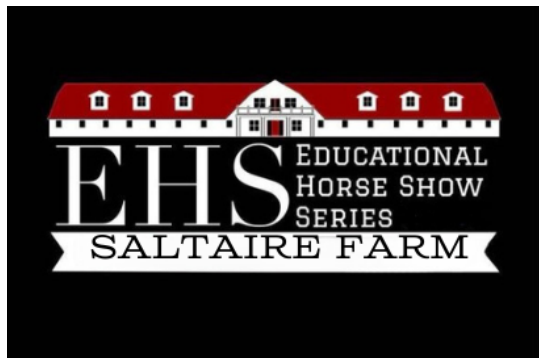

E.H.S. is following all the rules and regulations that UHJA requires, all classes on
the schedule and class list that are asterisk (*) are NOT UHJA point classes. If
you plan on riding in a UHJA medal class, you must be a member of UHJA.
Forms will be available in the show office. All class requirements are located on
the UHJA website under member resources.

1. EQUINE HEALTH AND WELFARE

Any horse on the show grounds with a fever of unknown origin or of suspicious origin must be reported to Horse Show Management and to the Show Veterinarian. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.
Please take the time to review equine hygiene practices. Please convey the importance of this to your equine caretakers for their daily routines.

2. RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER AND INDEMNIFICATION GR908

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing. In consideration for my participation in the Competition to the following: that the "Federation" and "Competition" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations. I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, lounge, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm"). I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition. I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition. I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR801 and, if applicable, EV114 and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above GR9 - PRIZE LISTS © USEF 2016 || provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition. I AGREE that if I am injured at this competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the Federation on the official USEF accident/injury report form. BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable Federation Rules and all terms and provisions of this entry blank and all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If I am signing and submitting this Agreement electronically, I acknowledge that my electronic signature shall have the same validity, force and effect as if I affixed my signature by my own hand.

3. HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE AND MANAGEMENT

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.
The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness,

fire or other cause

4. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS

Competition Days: Office opens one hour before the start of the first class and closes 30 minutes following the last class. Non-Competition Days: 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM

5. ENTRIES

The closing date for entries of the E.H.S. show is March 15th. Entries received at the show will be charged a late fee of \$20. Entries can be mailed to the address located on the entry form. Numbers WILL NOT be issued without a SIGNED OPEN CHECK/and or Venmo on file logged with the Horse Show Secretary.

All mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibiting

6. FEE SCHEDULE

Mandatory office/grounds fee of \$15/ day. Arenas will be available for schooling the day prior to the first day of competition. Please refer to the schedule for schooling times and heights.

Post Entry Fee. Regular fees will be charged for all post entries plus a \$20/ horse Post Entry Fee. A check returned for any reason will incur a \$50 Returned Check Fee.

Horses scratched from the show before the closing date will receive a full refund. on-Showing

Horse Fee: Non showing horses will pay a \$25 non-showing horse fee.

Convenience Fee: all accounts closed with a credit card will pay a 5% per entry convenience fee

7. ADDED CLASS POLICY

ALL ADD/DROPS WILL BE PERFORMED BY EXHIBITOR OR TRAINER

We encourage riders/trainers to add classes the day prior at no charge to allow for more accurate scheduling. Day-of-Ads will be based on schedule availability and management approval. There is no guarantee that Day-of-Ads will be accepted. Featured Classes: Horses entering the same day may be required to go first and will pay the entry fee

8. ACCIDENTS INVOLVING COMPETITORS USE GR1316.2

In the event of a fall/accident where the competitor is apparently unconscious or concussed, he/she is precluded from competing until evaluated by qualified medical personnel as defined in GR1211.5. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the competition.

EHS Guidelines & Class Descriptions

Saltaire Farm Educational Horse Show (EHS) Membership

New Members: For a \$50 fee, riders will be enrolled in the EHS membership program. Membership includes eligibility to earn points toward a Year End Award.

Membership Renewal: Membership can be renewed for \$45.

Non-Members: Riders who choose to compete in an EHS event who are not active EHS members will be charged \$10 per show.

Horse/Trainer Fees

Use of a Saltaire horse and trainer \$60 per day.

Daily show training fee for Saltaire boarders \$50 per day..

Office fee \$20 per rider (covers the jump crew, announcer, show secretary and supplies)

Stall Fees

Day Stall or Overnight Fee: \$20 per day. Talk to Kari about availability. Please clean your stall before you leave.

Entries

Class Fee: \$20 per class

Entries must be turned in with an accompanying open check no later than 48-hours before the competition.

Same- day entries will be accepted with a \$20 late fee. EHS shows have an open check policy, in alignment with USEF/USHJA regulations. Entries and checks may be placed in the EHS folder. **All entries must arrive, filled out, signed at the bottom and with an open check/ venmo account.** After completing their classes, a rider may check out with the show secretary to review charges and fill in the total.

Points and Year End Awards

Ribbons: Ribbons will be presented to 8th place in all classes. Prizes for 1st place will be awarded.

Points: Leadline, Beg. Cross Bar, and Advanced Cross Bar divisions award points to the rider. Open Division (2', 2'6, and 2'9/3'0 Open Hunters) award points to the horse. Short/Medium Stirrup (2'0), Low Child/Adult (2'6), Child/Adult (2'9/3'0) award points to the horse/rider combo. Riders in the Short/Medium Stirrup, Low Child/Adult, and Child/Adult Divisions can only ride one horse in equitation and or medal classes per show. Riders and horses are eligible to earn points in multiple divisions throughout the year. Classes may be split or combined depending on number of entries. Points will be awarded to original sections. Points will be awarded according to USEF standards 1st-10, 2nd-6, 3rd-4, 4th-2, 5th-1, 6th- 1/2.

Year End Awards: Prizes and ribbons will be awarded to year end champion and reserve champion in each division. Riders are required to have a current EHS membership in order to be eligible for year end awards. EHS Medal Finals will be awarded on the day and are not included in EHS Year End awards.

Equipment and Attire

Back Number: Registered riders will receive an entry number that will be worn at all times while competing. Riders may not enter the arena without the proper back number. See the show secretary to pick up your back number on the morning of the competition.

Helmet: Helmets are to be worn at all times while mounted on a horse. Anyone seen mounted without a USEF approved helmet will be disqualified.

Attire: Leadline, Beg. Cross Bar and Advanced Cross Bar divisions are required to wear a collared white shirt, tan breeches and approved helmet in accordance with USEF rules. Short/Medium Stirrup and above divisions are required to wear a white show shirt, tan breeches, hunt coat and approved helmet. White saddle pads or show pads are required.

Types of Classes

Ticketed Warm-Ups

Non-judged ticketed warm-up rounds will be offered daily throughout the show. Warm-up tickets are \$20 each. No points are awarded for ticketed rounds.

Equitation NTJ

Classes will be judged primarily on the rider - skills, form, balance, and control. Riders will enter the arena as a group and are asked to demonstrate the walk, trot, and canter in each direction. Riders may also be asked to demonstrate additional tests depending on experience, see Hunt Seat Tests 1-19 below.

Equitation O/F

Classes will be judged primarily on the rider. Riders will enter the arena one at a time to complete a course of jumps in the posted order. Riders will be rewarded for a seamless execution of the course and the most efficient track.

See

Hunt Seat Tests 1-19 below. Riders can only ride one horse per show in an equitation class.

Medal

Classes will be judged primarily on the rider. A medal class is an equitation class with additional tests.

Sometimes those additional tests are incorporated into the jumping course, while at other times there is a typical jumping

phase

followed by a flat portion or jumping call back, all judged as one class. See Hunt Seat Tests 1-19 below. Riders

Hunt Seat Tests 1-19

only ride one horse per show in a medal class.

Hunter O/F

Classes will be judged primarily on the horse. Judges will look for the horses that most closely conform to a "foxhunter's" way of going. Horses in this division should show forward movement, consistent pace, even rhythm,

willing attitude, and good manners. It is up to the rider to showcase these qualities. Riders will enter the arena one at a time to complete a course of jumps in the posted order.

Hunter U/S

Classes will be judged primarily on the horse. Riders will enter the arena as a group and asked to demonstrate the walk, trot, and canter in each direction.

Division Specifications

Lead Line

Riders will enter the arena with the assistance of a handler. They will be asked to demonstrate their horsemanship at the walk and may be asked to complete a course of poles and/or answer question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack and equipment and conformation. Points in this division follow the rider.

Ground Pole

Riders will complete a course of poles in the posted order. The course may be completed at the trot or the canter. Simple changes are permissible. Points in this division follow the rider.

Beginner Cross Bar

Riders will complete a course of crossbar fences in the posted order. The course may be completed at the trot or canter. Simple changes are permissible. Beginner crossbars do not include flower boxes. Points in this division follow the rider.

Advanced Cross Bar

Riders will complete a course of crossbar fences in the posted order. The course may be completed at the trot or canter. Simple changes are permissible. Crossbar fences will be set with flower boxes. Points in this division follow the rider. Riders will be divided by age if needed. Riders may only ride one horse per show in a medal class

Short/Medium Stirrup (2'0)

Riders will complete a course of 2' fences in the posted order. Simple changes are permissible. Points in this division follow the horse/ rider combo. Riders may only ride one horse per show in equitation and or medal classes.

Low Child/Adult (2'6)

Riders will complete a course of 2'6" fences in the posted order. Points in this division follow the horse/rider combo. Riders may only ride one horse per show in equitation and or medal classes.

Child/Adult (2'9/3'0)

Riders will complete a course of 3' fences in the posted order. Points in this division follow the horse/rider combo. Riders may only ride one horse per show in equitation and or medal classes.

Open Hunter (2'0, 2'6 2'9/3'0)

Riders will complete a course of fences in the posted order at the designated height. Open Hunter divisions are available to both professional and amateur competitors. Points in this division follow the horse.
