BEST Protocol allows a commercial beekeeper to select the best production hives from many of thousands of colonies and then test only those selected hives without treatment.

The detailed process:

During the spring and summer in North Dakota the Pol-line 2.2 program marks the best performing four hives in every bee yard, based on build up and honey production. Then when the last honey boxes are removed, those highest performing hives are not treated so we can later identify the colonies that can thrive without miticide. About October 1, all of those selected hives are evaluated to find the largest population, temperament, and mite loads from an alcohol wash. During February, in Texas, that pool of top producers are evaluated and mite washed again to pick the best hives as queen mothers to graft from. Successful hives maintain a mite load below 1% without treatment.

BEST Protocol and Pol-line 2.2 are the best ways to test bees for mite resistance and select new queen mothers.

I have appreciated Dennis's round-the-clock availability, "golden nuggets" of beekeeping wisdom, and most significantly – the quality queens he raises each year. I will continue to purchase VSH Pol-line 2.2 queen bees from Betty Bee Queen Co. to further promote those desired genetics needed for the future success in my beekeeping operations.
