



TNFD is a global initiative designed to help businesses understand and report their **nature-related risks and opportunities** — think of biodiversity, water, natural resources, and commodities.



What?

- Creates a framework for companies to assess and disclose how their operations impact and depend on nature.
- Supports decision-making by integrating nature into financial and strategic planning.
- **Encourages transparency** to shift global financial flows away from nature-negative outcomes and toward nature-positive ones.
- Enhances brand value by demonstrating to stakeholders and investors that risks and opportunities are understood and optimised.



How?

- Governance: Who's responsible for nature-related issues?
- Strategy: How does nature affect the business model?
- Risk Management: What are the risks and how are they managed?
- Metrics & Targets: How is progress measured?



Why?

Better Risk Management

TNFD helps businesses identify and mitigate nature-related risks—like supply chain disruptions due to biodiversity loss or water scarcity—which can protect revenues.

Improved Access to Capital

Investors are increasingly prioritizing nature-positive portfolios. Companies aligned with TNFD are more likely to attract sustainable investment and favourable financing terms.

Regulatory Readiness

TNFD aligns closely with emerging global regulations (like the EU's CSRD), helping businesses stay ahead of compliance requirements.

Enhanced Reputation & Trust

Transparent nature-related disclosures build credibility with stakeholders, customers, and investors. It signals that a company is forward-thinking and responsible.

Operational Efficiency

By analysing dependencies on natural resources (e.g., water, raw materials), companies can uncover inefficiencies and reduce costs.

Synergy with Climate Reporting

TNFD complements the TCFD reporting framework, so companies already reporting climate risks can integrate nature-related disclosures with minimal extra effort.
