

Spiced Pork Ribs

TOTAL TIME: 3 HOURS, 10 MINUTES | 6 SERVINGS INGREDIENTS: 2 RACKS (ABOUT 4 POUNDS) BABY BACK RIBS 1/4 CUP TAJÍN CLÁSÍCO SEASONING 1/4 CUP TAJÍN MILD HOT SAUCE, PLUS ADDITIONAL FOR SERVING, DIVIDED 2 TABLESPOONS OLIVE OIL 2 TABLESPOONS BROWN SUGAR LIME WEDGES, FOR SERVING MASHED POTATOES OR STEAMED RICE.

FOR SERVING (OPTIONAL)



DIRECTIONS:

Rub ribs with seasoning. Marinate at least 4 hours or overnight in refrigerator.

Preheat oven to 300 F. Combine hot sauce, oil and brown sugar; brush over both rib racks.

Line baking sheet with double layer of aluminum foil with enough overhang to wrap foil around ribs.

Lay ribs, bone side down, on foil-lined baking sheet. Wrap foil around ribs and seal. Place on baking sheet.

Fill large baking dish or roasting pan with 2 inches of boiling water. Place on lower oven rack to keep ribs moist as they bake. Place ribs on middle oven rack.

Bake 2 1/2-3 hours, or until meat is tender and just starting to fall off bone.

Preheat broiler. Unwrap ribs and place on foil-lined baking sheet. Broil 4-6 minutes on middle oven rack, or until lightly charred and caramelized.

BUILT IN 1845, HISTORIC HOME IS LABOR OF LOVE

The majestic home known as Rattle and Snap sits on a hilltop seven miles west of Columbia. Completed in 1845, it's considered one of the best examples of Greek Revival residential architecture in the country. This designated National Historic Landmark is home to retired Dr. Michael Kaslow and his wife, Bobbi.

The two lived in California when they bought the property 20 years ago, but Michael had deep ties to Maury County.

"I was born here, just outside Columbia," he explains. "My mother and grandmother lived here, and my great-grandfather fought in the Civil War. He was in the Bigby Greys."

A statue and marker in Mt. Pleasant tell the story of the Bigby Greys, a hundred local men sworn into Confederate service on

April 20th, 1861.

While Michael had roots here, it was Bobbi who had the idea to buy Rattle and Snap after first seeing the outside of the house during a visit with her mother-in-law. Then, a couple of years later, she returned and was able to go inside.

"We came on a tour," Bobbi recalls, "and once you see this place, it gets into your very soul. You never forget it. So, I went back to California, and told my husband we really ought to buy Rattle and Snap."

At the time, it wasn't for sale, but when it went on the market in 2003, they bought it.

"When we first came here, the house was basically falling apart," Bobbi explains. "There were 35 leaks in the roof, the col-

umns were rotting, the upstairs ceilings were cracked and coming down, and the inside walls were bubbling. We thought, what have we gotten ourselves into? But we just focused on one problem at a time, fixed it, and went on to the next."

Rebuilding, then furnishing the home, has been a labor of love, especially for Bobbi, who has extensive knowledge of antiques.

"I grew up in Greenwich, Connecticut, so I was used to big houses and fine furniture. And I've always been partial to the Victorian era, which is, of course, the period during which Rattle and Snap was built. So, we just did research, read books, and we started going to auctions."

Despite its size and many antiques, Rattle and Snap has a welcoming feel to it.

"It's 16,000 square feet, but in spite of that, it has a homey feel," says Bobbi." We do tours, and when people come here to visit, they always comment on how warm and comfortable it is."

During her tours, Bobbi shares the home's history, such as where it got its name. The house was built for George Polk, whose father, William Polk, was a land surveyor and won the tract of land during a game of chance called "rattle and snap."

She also delves into fascinating aspects of the home itself.

"I share what's original to the home, when it was built, what Greek Revival architecture is, and I talk about the columns. They're 28 feet tall, and they're Corinthian columns which are the most ornate. They were made in Cincinnati, Ohio, shipped down the Cumberland River to Nashville, and brought here by oxcart. When you think about that being done in the 1840s, it's amazing."

It's also interesting to note that Rattle and Snap has ten columns, while the White House in Washington, DC, only has eight.

"See how special that is," she says with a laugh. Michael dedicates a lot of his time to overseeing the landscap-

ing. Even though they've called this place home for nearly two decades, they're still in awe of it.

"When Michael drives up the driveway, he says he still can't believe we actually own this house," Bobbi says. "We feel more like caretakers than owners because it's so magnificent."

There's also a Rattle & Snap Whiskey, although it's not associated with the Maury County plantation.

The whiskey, which hit shelves last September, is produced by the Log Still Distillery in Gethsemane, Kentucky. Wally Dant, president, and distiller, explains how he decided on the name.

"I wanted to have a Kentucky brand, but I also wanted to pay tribute to Tennessee, which had been my home for the past 22 years," he says. "Kentucky and Tennessee both make great bourbons and whiskeys, so I thought we could have a great Tennessee brand and call it Rattle & Snap after the game of chance."

He says the name was also a way to have a little fun with it. The whiskey's side label refers to "making your own luck," which works well since getting into the bourbon and whiskey business can often be a bit of a gamble.

Dant describes the whiskey as having "a little sweeter profile with a bit of back-end spice you get from the rye grain that's in there." Inspiring generations of memories, gathered around the table




