


TREE LIGHTING SEASON IS HERE

COMMUNITY SNAPSHOTS

HERITAGE FOUNDATION PRESERVATION AWARDS

For 47 years, as a part of its nonprofit mission, the Heritage Foundation has recognized preservation projects and individuals who made significant contributions within the field of historic preservation. The Preservation Awards recognize the rehabilitation, restoration, preservation, and craftsmanship of residential and commercial structures that complement the historic character of Williamson County.

In 2023, the Heritage Foundation awarded six distinct projects and a Lifetime Achievement Award for decades of historic preservation.

LIFETIME PRESERVATION ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: Ms. Thelma Battle, African American historian of Williamson County.

Franklin native Thelma Battle, is the foremost historian who has pioneered the study of African-American history and culture in Williamson County. For nearly forty years, she has led the way in conducting oral histories from across the county while elevating the stories of many throughout her many publications. Considered the leading expert on African American Cultural Studies in Williamson County, her vast photograph and oral histories collections are housed at several local repositories, including the Williamson County Archives, the Special Collections at the Williamson County Library, the Heritage Foundation of Williamson County, and the African American Heritage Society. Through her preservation advocacy work, she championed saving the Natchez neighborhood. She is one of the founders of the African American Heritage Society of Williamson County and pursued saving the historic McLemore House in the Hard Bargain Neighborhood.

EXCELLENCE IN PRESERVATION THROUGH REHABILITATION

(RESIDENTIAL): 402 Bridge Street, owned by Ryan and Laura Grant

This award recognizes the Grant's vision of appropriately conserving the historic home while carefully incorporating modern upgrades, using sustainable treatments to lessen the impact on the historic brickwork.

EXCELLENCE IN PRESERVATION THROUGH REHABILITATION (COMMERCIAL): Stable Reserve

This award recognizes Stable Reserve, a new business on Main Street, for appropriately conserving a historic commercial building, carefully incorporating modern upgrades, while preserving original flooring and intentionally highlighting key architectural features.

PRESERVATION THROUGH RESTORATION: Wyatt Hall, Dr. Benny, and Mrs. Alex Woody

This award recognizes the Woody's for exemplary restoration of Wyatt Hall by retaining its integrity throughout the c1800 home.



PLAYIN' POSSUM

Ten years after the death of legendary country singer George Jones, the woman credited with turning his life around felt it was time to tell their story.

"After 30 years of being married to George and 32 years together," Nancy Jones says, "if anybody knew George Jones, I did. And I wanted to set the record straight on how sweet he was, but also what I went through, with the help of the good Lord, to get him off drugs and alcohol. And I didn't cut any corners; I told the truth."

"Playin' Possum" (referring to George's nickname) is full of behind-the-scenes stories about George's life in music, interactions with his famous friends like Johnny Cash, Waylon Jennings, Randy Travis, Alan Jackson, even his relationship with Tammy Wynette in the years after they divorced.

Nancy co-wrote the book with noted author Ken Abraham.

"Nancy's a pretty good storyteller, so she made the job easy," Abraham says. "But then doing the research and talking to people in Nashville, some of the people who worked with George on the road, and just putting all those memories together, you get to the core of the truth."

Recognized as one of the greatest singers in country music with signature songs like "White Lightning," "She Thinks I Still Care," and "He Stopped Loving Her Today," and others, George Jones was also well-known for his problems with drugs and alcohol. In fact, he missed so many of his own shows, that he was dubbed "No Show Jones."

During their early years together, when his use of drugs and alcohol was at its peak, Nancy suffered a lot of physical abuse and details some of it in her book. But everything changed in 1999 after George had his near-fatal accident outside Nashville. He found his faith, learned to pray, and became the man she says she always knew he could be.

"From 1999 to 2013, I was so blessed," Nancy says. "I was blessed because God stopped everything. There was no more drinking, no drugs, no nothing. I had the perfect husband."

Readers get to see the generous and funny side of George and his relationship with other country artists he knew and loved. For



Nancy, going back through years of memories was challenging but worth it.

"I think I cried every day and every night when I started writing it," she says.

And yet, it was especially meaningful to remember those who helped her during difficult times, like Johnny Cash and Waylon Jennings.

"I never would have made it without Johnny and Waylon helping me with George. Waylon was so precious, and Johnny never called him George; he always called him Little Pal. And anytime I picked up the phone to call either of them, they were always there for me. That's something I will always cherish."

Nancy tells the correct version of the story people have heard for years about the wife who took George's car keys away to keep him from going after alcohol, only to find George later driving to the liquor store on a tractor. She explains why George was reluctant to record "He Stopped Loving Her Today," thinking fans wouldn't like it. And she shares a story most people haven't heard about how George was initially supposed to be on the plane that crashed with Patsy Cline.

The book is Nancy's story, too. She touches on difficult health challenges such as her near-death COVID experience, her special friendship with Lisa Marie Presley and others, and why she decided it was time to write this book.

"With me being in the hospital in 2021, dying and coming back, it got me thinking, and I wanted to thank God for the healing power he put on me and George Jones," she says.

And she's hoping their story might inspire others.

"I wouldn't turn back nothing because I know God was me with through this whole thing, and George did, too. He wanted those demons gone, but it was hard to get them out of there, but we whipped 'em all. George was a very spiritual person, and I want people to know that."

IN GOOD SPIRITS

The history of Thompson's Station can be traced back to the late 1700s, yet the town has never been home to a liquor store. That will soon change, however, when Tollgate Wine & Spirits—at 1990 Tollgate Boulevard in the Tollgate Village subdivision opens its doors later this year.

"I saw the opportunity a couple of years ago and signed our lease only to find out that Thompson's Station wasn't zoned for a liquor store," recalls Steve Poe, who also owns Westside Wine & Spirits on Front Street in Westhaven (Franklin). "To change the zoning, you need to have a petition with ten percent of the people that voted in the last election, so I had to get 290 signatures to get on the ballot last November. I did that by reaching out to the homeowner's associations at a couple of the larger communities in Thompson's Station and asked them if I could set up a table and collect signatures."

Long story short, Poe collected the required signatures, and local voters had the opportunity to decide on the measure in November 2022. It passed with upwards of 80 percent approval, according to Poe.

"I would say that the idea was pretty well received," he adds, noting that he expects to draw customers from Spring Hill, in addition to Thompson Station neighborhoods like Bridgemore, Canterbury, and Tollgate, as well as points north.

As one might expect, Poe says Tollgate Wine & Spirits will carry all the major brands but also plans to stock products from local breweries, distilleries, and wineries. That includes Company Distilling in Thompson's Station, which sells both a Tennessee

Dry Gin and a Bourbon Whiskey; Leiper's Fork Distillery, which produces a selection of high-end whiskies; and Stable Reserve Spirits, found on Main St. in Franklin.

Clearly, the liquor store business is treating Poe well, and he says he is enjoying life as much as ever before, having left behind a career in Information Technology to become a small business owner.

"I was an IT professional in corporate America, having made my way up through the ranks, beginning at the help desk. Then, I worked servers, security, and networking before moving into IT management. But I was on-call 24/7. These days, I don't have to be glued to my phone, and my commute to work is a five-minute ride in a golf cart. It has been a change for the better in terms of my health and sanity," he says before noting that he also works as a real estate agent for United Country Real Estate Leipers Fork.

Now Poe—a Macon, Georgia native who has lived in the Nashville metropolitan area since 2003—thinks things will only get better for Thompson's Station in the years ahead.

"I know there are a couple of challenges surrounding the sewer system, but once the infrastructure is in place, it's going to be an even nicer community," he says. "Hopefully, they are going to control growth so it doesn't get too dense, but it's going to be a really great area right off of 840."

Meanwhile, Poe looks forward to establishing his new store and becoming an integral part of the Thompson's Station community.

"Hopefully, I will be able to hire some people from Thompson's Station, and I will definitely start supporting the local community," he says, much like he supports charities via The Westhaven Foundation in Franklin, not to mention area schools like Pearre Creek Elementary. "Once I get my team in place and my sales up, I'll be more than glad to help."

That said, he encourages people to follow Tollgate Wine & Spirits on Facebook and Instagram for information about the store's grand opening, which he expects to take place close to Thanksgiving Day.

"No details yet," he concludes. "We might do a soft opening, but we'll definitely advertise what we'll be doing."




