

SPRING HILL TO HOST TWO FESTIVALS IN ONE GREAT WEEKEND

THE WHOLE HOG FESTIVAL

Spring Hill's "Whole Hog Festival" gets bigger and better every year with more pork-themed events, added attractions for kids and adults, and more craft vendors, food, and live music.

Organizers will bring back the Antique Tractor Show, the chance to win free-bacon-for-a-year, and the old-fashioned cake walk they introduced last year. But they're also adding a new bacon-eating contest, a children's circus troupe, and the chance to ride, not a mechanical bull, but a mechanical pig.

"You've seen those bucking horses or cows that people ride to see if they can do it without falling off," says Sally Sassen, Chief Executive Officer of The Well Outreach. "We're going to have a bucking pig called Porkchop. Each year we try to add new things and some surprise elements, as well."

The bacon-eating contest will also be a big deal. It's a timed contest to see who can eat 2 pounds of bacon the fastest, provided by Hitman Smoked Products. The winner receives \$100.

The popular festival, scheduled for Saturday, October 8th, marks its 15th anniversary this year. Originally called The Country Ham Festival, it started in 2005 but took a break in 2018. Then, John Maher Builders brought it back in 2019 with a new name and a partnership with "The Well Outreach," a local food pantry that serves families in crisis.

"This is one of three fundraisers for us each year, and this one, is very important to us," Sassen explains. "It lets us love on our community and share a little bit about the story of The Well." Organizers have spent months working to bring this year's festival together. There will be live music from start to finish featuring

FINANCIAL FOCUS

PREPARE YOURSELF FOR A LONG RETIREMENT

We all want to live long lives. We all expect to live long lives. But are we financially prepared for this longevity?

Before we get to the issue of preparation, let's look at a couple of interesting findings from a 2022 survey by Age Wave and Edward Jones:

- The surveyed retirees said, on average, they expect to live to 89, and they said the ideal length of retirement is 29 years.
- When asked if they want to live to 100, nearly 70% of the respondents said "yes." The

main reason for this desire for long life? To spend more years with their family and friends.

So, while you're still working, try to reduce unwanted debts, particularly those that don't offer the financial benefits of tax-deductible interest payments. The lower your debt load, the more you can save and invest for the future.
- **KEEP REVIEWING YOUR PROGRESS.** It's important to monitor the progress you need to make toward achieving your goal of a comfortable retirement. Over the short term, your investment balances may fluctuate, especially in volatile financial markets such as we've seen in the early part of this year. But you'll get a clearer picture of your situation if you look at long-term results. For example, have your accounts grown over the past 10 years as much as you had planned? And going forward, do you think you're in good shape, or will you need to make some changes to your investment strategy? Keep in mind that, if you're 50 or older, you can make "catch-up" contributions to your IRA and 401(k) that allow you to exceed the regular limits. You may also want to adjust your investment mix as you near retirement to potentially lower your risk exposure.

Hopefully, you will enjoy many years of a healthy, happy retirement. And you can help support this vision by carefully considering your financial moves and making the ones that are right for you.

KIMCHI

11/2 CUPS GREEN CABBAGE, CUT INTO THICK STRIPS 1/4 CUP WATER

4 TEASPOONS WHITE VINEGAR

1 TABLESPOON GOCHUJANG PASTE

2 TEASPOONS FISH SAUCE

1/2 TEASPOON MINCED GARLIC

1/2 TEASPOON MINCED, PEELED GINGER ROOT

1/2 CUP DAIKON RADISH STRIPS

1/4 CUP SHREDDED, PEELED CARROT

1/4 CUP SLICED GREEN ONION

MANGO SLAW

2 CUPS SHREDDED GREEN CABBAGE

1/3 CUP DICED MANGO CHUNKS, THAWED FROM FROZEN

1/4 CUP SHREDDED, PEELED CARROT

1/4 CUP SLICED GREEN ONION

1/4 CUP RED BELL PEPPER, CUT INTO THIN STRIPS

2 TABLESPOONS CHOPPED FRESH CILANTRO

2 TABLESPOONS MINCED, PEELED GINGER ROOT

2 TABLESPOONS WHITE VINEGAR

1/2 TEASPOON KOSHER SALT

1/4 TEASPOON MINCED GARLIC

To make kimchi: Place cabbage in microwavable bowl. Add water. Cover and microwave on high 2 minutes, or until tender-crisp. Rinse with cold water and drain well. In large bowl, mix vinegar, gochujang, fish sauce, garlic and ginger. Add steamed cabbage, daikon, carrot and onion; toss to coat. Cover and chill.

To make mango slaw: Mix cabbage, mango, carrot, onion, red bell pepper, cilantro, ginger, vinegar, salt and garlic. Cover and chill.

To make spicy sesame mayonnaise: Mix mayonnaise, sriracha, sesame oil and vinegar until well blended. Cover and chill.

Heat grill to medium and lightly oil grill rack. Grill bratwursts 8 minutes, or until internal temperature reaches 155 F.Spread mayonnaise on rolls. Place grilled bratwurst on rolls and top with kimchi and slaw.




