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Please ensure that if your child is wearing sneakers with laces, they know how to tie them.



Writing Workshop

Math Workshop

OLDERS: Defining and non-defining attributes of 3-D figures: number of faces, number of vertices, number of edges, number of flat surfaces, and type of shape for faces and flat surfaces. You can practice at home by having your child look in the cabinet for these shapes.

YOUNGERS: Our new unit introduces measurement by teaching that objects can be directly compared by length, height, volume, or weight. We will develop an understanding of tools that can be used to measure those attributes.

Youngers: Practice doubles facts so you are ready for first-grade.

Reading Workshop

In unit 8, we will be discussing, reading and writing about observing and exploring the sky.

- Explain similarities and differences between information in visuals and text. (This is sometimes difficult as the children want to say what they know instead of what is in the picture.)
- · Identify the topic and relevant details.
- Identify and discuss text features.
- Use context clues to determine the meaning of unknown words.

PHONICS:

OLDERS: Learned about —tch & ch & -dge. We know that we use —tch & -edge at the end of a word immediately after a short vowel. (exceptions: such, much)

YOUNGERS: Worked on initial z and short a. Give your child CVC words to write.
