Science

We have been learning about the importance of water, as well as water safety. We researched the different bodies of water and looked at how they are the same and different. We learned that animals who live in water live in either salt or fresh water. We looked at the location of our oceans and found the ocean we swim in. Mr. Saban taught us that when salt water and fresh water meet it is called, brackish.

We are currently discussing water safety and what is needed to keep everyone safe around any body of water.



Math Workshop

Olders: Our topic 8 develops the concept of tens and ones, which is the key foundation of the base-10 number system. This topic strengthens students' understanding of the place-value system and prepares them for 2-digit addition and subtraction.

Youngers: Our topic 8 includes both addition and subtraction as they build reliability with both operations within 10. It also focuses on another type of real-world problem, both adds unknown, with sums to 10, and find missing parts to 10. You can help your child by practicing facts to 10. "If I have 7, I need ? To make 10"

Reading Workshop

In unit 4, we will talk, read, and write about narrators and how people create different kinds of stories. Our knowledge vocabulary words are realistic, fantasy, perspective and experience. (discuss these words with your child)

We worked on explaining who is telling the story using context clues. This is a difficult concept but one that you can support at home. As you are reading with your child, discuss who is telling the story and how you know.
