absent out on det. absent out 2 rolls July 28/65. ✓  
at Jacksonport, Ark.

Records of Postmaster General show "he was  
rec<sup>d</sup> at Minn. Inf. Regt. 3<sup>d</sup> 1864 and departed  
Oct 25/64. No record of return or arrest.

He was sent to the 3<sup>d</sup> Minn. Inf. Regt. Jan'y 29/65.  
Permit<sup>ly</sup> in forwarding rolls, "is there from  
the loss of a toe cut off while he was absent from  
this Post on a pass four months ago." Delivered  
to Lt. Col. Samuel Hamilton, Comd'g Officer for  
working permits Cairo, Ill., Feb. 4/65. No cause  
for retention at St. Paul shown.

No evidence of alleged disabilities. Reg'l Hoopl  
records covering dates from Oct 25/64 to May 28/65  
his name is not borne.
