Bergin University of Canine Studies

Earlier this year our Dog Kennel Manager learned of an opportunity to work with Devan and his students at Bergin University of Canine Studies, so of course we jumped at it! Our shelter was chosen for this opportunity and our dogs benefited in a big way from all the support we received. Devan's knowledge and experience working with shelter dogs and the support from his eager students exceeded our expectations. The BU students helped with everything from playgroups to vaccines and we enjoyed their enthusiasm, here on site, every Friday. Here is what instructor Devan Amundsen had to say about their experience this semester at HSIMC:

"At Bergin University, (berginu.edu,) our mission is to advance the human-canine connection through research and education. One of the many ways we accomplish this is through our hands-on work with dogs in shelters and rescues. This semester, the fantastic team at the Humane Society of Inland Mendocino County welcomed our bachelor students into their shelter with unparalleled levels of enthusiasm and open arms. Our students made the trip from campus in Penngrove up to Redwood Valley to spend 4 hours every Friday with the dogs in the care of HSIMC.

Our students have assisted with dog introductions, small play groups, quiet kennel activities, obedience exercises. bathing/grooming, intakes, vaccines and of course a bit of general love and attention for the dogs. Our students graduate from the programs at Bergin University and work in a wide range of fields in the canine industry. Some become service dog trainers, others pet dog trainers, dog groomers, police K9 trainers, agility trainers, and a growing number are working in animal shelters. Regardless of their paths post-graduation, our students know that their work in any field impacts the overall welfare of the animals and the people in their community.



Thank you to the staff, volunteers, supporters, and dogs of HSIMC for making our students and instructor feel so welcome in your facility. We are so thankful for our partnership with HSIMC, and cannot wait to return for future semesters and collaborations".

Feline Leukemaia (FeLV) Cottage

Last year we had two very generous donors contribute to purchasing a small building to house FeLV (Feline Leukemia) cats. After hours, days and months of work from our wonderful volunteers, the FeLV cottage is now housing our three FeLV cats, Gary, Magick and Shade. These boys have all the space of their own building and an attached catio for outside sunbathing time.

We are proud and happy to say we can safely accommodate these special kitties at our shelter. We are also the only rescue in our area accepting FeLV positive cats with the intention of finding them new forever homes. What many do not know is that FeLV cats are euthanized at their positive test result at clinics and shelters everywhere.

Our team does not believe that having Feline Leukemia denies these kitties a full and loved life. FeLV is species specific and is only contagious to cats; it is not contagious to humans, dogs or other non-cat animals. FeLV positive cats can live, on average, 2-5 years beyond when they are first diagnosed, sometimes even longer. Our friend Magick was diagnosed back in 2015 and is still going strong.

Our FeLV Cottage is a blessing to have and we cannot thank everyone who contributed enough for giving us the opportunity to keep helping special kitties like Gary, Shade and Magick. Huge thank you to Tracey McNamara, Stacey Rohrbaugh & Mary Miller for all your hard work to make this a reality!

Huge shout out to Susan Aguilar for donating her Honda Prelude to HSIMC!


Thank you for being the first to donate a vehicle!

Wiley had so much support to get her off the streets, now let's rally again to get her an amazing forever home!



Letter From Our Board President:

Dear HSIMC Members and Supporting Public,

Since our last newsletter, we have transitioned from anticipating the freshness of spring, to a season of heat and preparedness.

In June we enjoyed our first in-person event in over a year. Anderson Valley Brewing Co. President, Kevin McGee, graciously invited HSIMC to host our "Community Celebration" at the parklike brewery grounds in Booneville. Our team of Board Members, volunteers and staff served up food, drink, HSIMC merchandise, raffle tickets, and most of all good cheer. Waylon and the Wild Cats rocked the park with their musical talents to the delight of all in attendance.

The following day, Sunday June 27th, we held our first ever "Paw-ty Party", a silly raffle drawing in which a litter of puppies chose the raffle prizes. Perhaps you watched the Live video on our Facebook feed. It was a fun, laugh-inducing good time. We watched and cheered as tiny puppies wandered and peed on a numbered grid of potty pads. Our newest Board of Directors member, Jaime Wilkes, drew raffle ticket winners for the designated prizes. A special thanks to Rainbow Ag Ukiah, for donations and for allowing our team to sell raffle tickets outside of Rainbow in June. Additional thanks to Sparetime Garden Center in Willits for donating a beautiful raffle basket. Our wonderful silly raffle brought in over \$5,000 for the needy animals in our charge.

The most recent event of note at our shelter was our need to evacuate the animals due to concerns regarding the #BroilerFire in Redwood Valley. On Wednesday July 7th, our steadfast shelter leadership, Director Jenny, initiated the shelter's evacuation plan and coordinated the employees and volunteers in swiftly and safely evacuating the shelter's animal population. It was an astounding feat to behold. Over 100 cats were caged and convoyed out to a safe location in about an hour's time. Simultaneously, the dog team loaded the shelter dogs into vehicles and saw them off as volunteers and fosters whisked them away from the fire evacuation zone. The success of the evacuation is primarily attributed to the all-star shelter team, Director Jenny, and managers Becca and Suzanne, as well as all of the shelter staff, board members, volunteers, fosters, and concerned citizens, who in a moment's notice, jumped into coordinated action to ensure the safety of our community's vulnerable animals. Deep gratitude to the firefighters and first responders in their brave, lifesaving service. Lastly, our heartfelt sympathies for our neighbors affected by fire.

The #BroilerFire served as a live evacuation drill. Our efforts were successful and highlighted areas of need. We have one evacuation trailer. It is excellent for transporting our equipment and supplies; it is lacking an a/c unit. It would have been too hot to host kenneled dogs for any length of time. We are accepting monetary donations for the install of an a/c unit. We also determined the need for an additional animal transport vehicle.

If you or someone you know would like to donate a large air-conditioned cargo van, small RV, a small "toy hauler", trailer, etc., please reach out to our team.

We are looking forward to our next event, "Christmas in July". It will be a fun, white elephant inspired, mystery gift grab with a drive-thru twist. We have 100+ wrapped mystery gifts. On 7/24/2021 if you come to our shelter, and donate \$20, you will get a wrapped gift. There is a wide range of values. Mystery gifts include: books, jewelry, new LEGO sets, numerous gift certificates, and MORE! Remember, this is a fundraiser to support the animals, join us and have fun!

My personal hope is that you are as heartened by our stories of success and need as I am. I look forward to our community's ongoing involvement and participation in our shelter's activities creating a bright future for the animals we save.


