East Hill Saves the Day (and lots of lives)



Every year, we take in over a thousand animals. The majority of these animals are unaltered when they come to us. That is hundreds of cats and dogs to spay and neuter before they find homes.

Our veterinarian Dr. Chana and her team at East Hill Veterinary Clinic, spay and neuter hundreds of cats and dogs for our shelter, making their adoption possible.

Early this year, we found ourselves in need of even more help with spays and neuters because there was a spike in unaltered animals. So, Dr. Chana has generously set aside a full day, once a week, to spay and neuter as many animals as she can for us.

We are quickly catching up and spayed and neutered animals are being adopted nearly as fast as they come in.

We would like to make a big *shout out*, a huge *thank you* and express our undying gratitude to **East Hill Veterinary Clinic** for always being there and making our world go 'round.

Just a Little Tipsy Kitty

By now you must have heard about a special little kitten called Tipsy. But if you haven't, here is her story:

Tipsy came to us at the age of four weeks old, skin and bones, extremely anemic, dehydrated and covered with fleas. But what stood out the most was her inability to stand or sit up without falling over. She was immediately fostered by our Cattery Manager and seen by our veterinarian, Dr. Chana.

After battling with her anemia and malnutrition, Tipsy was diagnosed with Cerebellar Hypoplasia; a neurological condition that makes her feel constantly off balance.

Tipsy spends her days playing, eating, and getting some physical therapy and workout time with her foster family to help her walk someday.



Her story started out pretty bleak, but this girl has the will to keep going and gets stronger every day. Go Tipsy we're there for you!!

Here is where you come in: The majority of the cats we take every year are kittens. Hundreds of them, so we need foster homes, short and long term. Bottle baby fosters and senior cat fosters.

How long have you been volunteering at the Humane Society? This time around 4 years. 2011 - 2012 I was a volunteer walking dogs.

What do you do here?

I was working full time and I would come on the weekends to walk dogs. I thought I'd do dog training when I retired. I was laid off from my job in 2018, and as soon as that happened, I took a nine-month dog training course. Briefly worked with puppy training in SF and then in Marin County. Then I got referred to HSIMC.

I had the book knowledge but needed the handling knowledge. I now understand what the body language means and am working on helping dogs transition through the changes caused by being in the shelter.

Sarah Thompson (K9 No Limits) has been a mentor to me and really helped many of us here on how to deal with challenging dogs.

I live in Redwood Valley with my dog Buddy who I got in 2019 from HSIMC and my long-term foster, Willow! She has come a long way. Both dogs have taught me *tons* about dog behavior.

What I've learned with training is trying to understand it from the dog's perspective.

Life outside of the shelter? What do you enjoy?

I do art. I really enjoy that, and I study a lot of dog training stuff. My last working life was in textile design. I've been helping a designer with her textile creativity. Spending time with friends, hiking, hanging out.

What would you like people to know about the Humane Society?

First step is to let people know we're here.

When we adopt or foster out an animal, we really want to support the transition. I get referrals all the time for adopters who need help. It would be great, with the resources here, for long term assistance to adopters to make sure it's a positive and lifelong relationship.

There are all kinds of opportunities here for volunteers to learn how to really understand how to help the animals.


