GRANT Received

Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County receives Animal Welfare Grant from the Community Foundation

Redwood Valley, CA – In November, the Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County received a non-competitive grant through the Animal Welfare Grant Program.

The Animal Welfare Grant Program provides financial support for organizations that care for pets and wildlife in our community. A total of \$208,000 was distributed throughout the county, with varying grant size based on the scope of the organization and its operational capacity.

County shelters, private veterinary clinics, nonprofit organizations, and state wildlife offices play a vital role in the health, safety, and protection of domestic animals and wildlife. However, the largely volunteer run nonprofit organizations face unique financial and programmatic ripple effects from the pandemic. The challenges faced by HSIMC have changed and evolved during this time but we have continued to evolve and change with it. The largest challenges we currently face are lack of general resources and spay and neuter availability. We cannot continue our lifesaving work without the support from our local veterinarians and we are so grateful for every appointment and surgery day we receive. These grants will help mitigate some of the difficulties faced by local organizations and allow them to increase capacity to help meet need.

This grant has given the Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County the affordability to meet the rising costs of animal care and continue to care for the animals that come through our shelter. In 2022, we took in 1199 animals, more than any other year, and we hope to continue to have the funding to support our lifesaving work.

The Animal Welfare Grant Program is made possible thanks to the Fund for Animal Welfare and the Jacob-Woods Animal Care Fund. Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County appreciates the continued generosity of the Community Foundation and the donors who help make a difference throughout Mendocino County.

Gary had come to us from Wasson Memorial Clinic after he was diagnosed with FeLV (Feline Leukemia Virus). He stayed with us for over a year despite how wonderfully sweet and handsome he is.

Then one day, we got a call from a very nice lady who was looking for an orange tabby cat and we instantly thought of Gary. Gary's new person was so excited to meet him, and she fell in love with him the second she saw him hanging out in the FeLV cottage. He went home with her later that week.

Every FeLV cat needs to have a love story like this one. We now have four FeLV cats in our cottage that are looking for their fairytale ending.

We know that Feline Leukemia sounds scary, but they can live full and healthy lives. The restrictions on these cats are minimal; they must stay indoors and cannot live with cats who do not already have FeLV.

Feline Leukemia is only contagious to other cats. And if they are kept healthy, they usually do not need ongoing medical care. They might have slightly shorter lives, or they might live for many years to come. Most of all, they deserve all the love that a "regular" cat does.

So, if you are looking for a single cat, or even multiple cats, we have four long term resident FeLV cats that would really LOVE to go home with you.

This free service is offered by Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County as part of our Rehoming Packet.

Pet owners can provide text and images to be posted to HSIMC's website.

The Humane Society of Inland Mendocino County accepts no responsibility for the pets posted to this page.

Potential adopters are responsible for communicating with the pet's guardian to acquire veterinary records and other necessary information.

If you need to find a home for a pet you can no longer care for, please read, and follow these steps:

PET GUARDIANS:

- Complete the "Owner and Pet Information" form at <https://mendohumanesociety.com/adoptions-by-owner>.
- The information and photo you provide will be made available to the public on HSIMC's website.

*NOTE: Your posting will not appear immediately but will be reviewed within 72 hours.
Please only submit **one request**.*

- Include the following information about your pet: pet description, age, spay/neuter status, and any other information that will help in finding the right home for your pet.
- Upload an image of your pet (Individual files cannot exceed 10 MB. If multiple files are uploaded the total cannot exceed 15 MB).
- Your post will remain on HSIMC's website for 30 days and will automatically be removed unless a request is made to keep the post active.
- If/when you rehome your pet, please let us know via email: info@hsimc.org

- Those looking for pets, should contact the PET GUARDIAN'S directly at the phone # and/or email address provided by you in the posting.
- No HSIMC website or staff correspondence will occur.

Letter from our Board President

2022 has been an eventful year and we have much to be thankful for. Through the end of November, HSIMC has rescued and found homes for over 1100 cats and dogs. A very significant number and something we can take great pride in. Many of you are aware that there were several times during the year when HSIMC had to limit our intake of animals. This was due to being at full capacity or as a result of financial stress. During these times, we have worked extremely hard to understand our cost structure. Through the usage of cost modeling, we have been able to gather data on how to better manage our shelter, better service our community and better provide for the welfare of our employees. It is important that HSIMC is financially healthy to continue our work and have viable solutions to what has become a nationwide problem with pet population, an issue that can only be addressed in the short term by increasing our handling capacity, but in the longer term through education.

The data mentioned earlier has provided insight into several ideas that have since been implemented in order to have better control over our operations. Most important is that we strive to obtain a balance between pet intakes and outcomes (adoptions). Not having parity in this area only creates overcrowding and contributes to a pet length of stay issue, which requires additional resources to support. Long term the shelter is not a healthy environment, and it is in everyone's best interest to try and keep pets in their homes or if they do become wards of HSIMC, we endeavor to get them into new homes as quickly as possible. Spay and neutering has always been a bottleneck and expanding our ability to have this task performed is the key to our future success.

Another area we will improve over the course of the next year is to address cats and dogs which have been in our care for longer than anyone would like. Many of these are adults and unfortunately less desirable to adopters, although I can assure you that these pets have many outstanding qualities, and we believe that there is a segment in our community that will embrace them. This is something we will focus on; the solutions are there. As a non-profit, solely dependent on fundraising and support from our community, you have heard our cries for help over the past year and answered the bell many times. Some of you have requested to be anonymous and we respect that, however, understand that if we could, there would be a huge parade to celebrate and thank each and every one of you for your generous and continuous support.

I want to update everyone on our improvement activities, the electrical upgrade is still in progress, we had to make a few modifications due to PGE requirements, but nothing that is a show stopper. Once completed, we will also install a generator with a transfer switch so that when the grid fails, we still have power. We need this for refrigerating our medications, heating/cooling, and the ability to have water. Longer term SOLAR is on our agenda! Another project soon to be completed (Jan 2023) will be the refurbishment of the cattery, fresh paint, new mini-split heating/cooling, all new linoleum flooring (courtesy of Healdsburg Floor Coverings and Clay Nesbitt) and a grand re-opening ceremony. Its early December when I write this so, I don't want to complain about rain, but if we can catch a respite sometime this month the dog kennel will get a new roof over the current open area (courtesy of B.A.S. Roofing). This is an area that is currently exposed to the elements and difficult to keep comfortable for dogs that do not go into foster during extreme weather conditions. We also plan to upgrade the heating/cooling and install some new insulated and robust doggie doors.

It's important that HSIMC have a presence in the community and support those who also provide support to us. Events that we participated in this quarter were, the Willits Harvest Festival, JD Redhouse Sale, Trunk & Treat at HSIMC, Subaru Share the Love and the Ukiah Holiday Parade. We would like to thank and acknowledge the Community Foundation for their very significant contribution, it was extremely timely. Thanks to Anderson Valley Brewing Company in Boonville for their continued support. Don't forget to buy your 2023 calendars, only \$20 and the best cat and dog images ever! Believe me this is a big help to the shelter.

HSIMC as an organization is only as good as the people that are involved in supporting our efforts, our employees are fundamental to the successes that we have, without their commitment and passion we could not achieve what is necessary. The volunteers and fosters who are tireless in their efforts, make such an impact and contribution that is impossible to measure. Our Board of Directors are always available to step up to the challenge and make what seems impossible, possible. It takes a village! And we certainly have a very large one.

On a personal note, this has been a very positive and fulfilling year for me, as a novice in the world of rescue there were many people who have helped to educate and nurture me on this journey. You may not realize how impactful your influence has been, but if you reflect on all of the recent and future accomplishments, it is extremely evident. I trust I can count on your continued support.
