- ★ Fear Free Shelter Thomas, Suzanne and Emily have completed their Fear Free Shelter certificates!
- ★ Raeann is having a baby! No not a puppy or kitten- a HUMAN baby!
- ★ Staff Meeting: We make them fun with snacks and dogs! Important updates with a focus on animal outcomes and reducing costs at the shelter by being efficient and aware
- ★ Thomas is awarded the first "Fear Free in Action" award. This award goes to staff members who are caught in the ACT! The act of helping our shelter animals navigate their shelter journey with the least fear, anxiety, stress or frustration as possible. Way to go Tommy!

MEDICAL

- ★ Ralph (dog) has an emergency dental on 3/26 and 22 teeth removed!
- ★ Careavan provides us an additional surgery day for 10-12 dogs!
- ★ Craig (cat)- Pectus Excavatum diagnosis leads to failure to thrive despite attempt to treat the condition.
- ★ Morty (cat)- unknown infection and GI inflam with ascites. Untreatable. Euthanasia 3/31.
- ★ Bailey (dog) cancer found at spay surgery, we made the decision with her FTA family to humanely euthanize
- ★ Bugaboo (dog) crashed on surgery table during spay but was able to be revived by Dr. Chana - phew!
- ★ Walter Jr. (dog) gets treatment and survives parvovirus

Shelter Operations Wins/Challenges

CHALLENGES

- ★ Plumbing issues and leak at our dog barn causes ongoing water challenges for our dog team, laundry and public restroom
- ★ Short staffing
- ★ Laundry overload!
- ★ Kitten season has officially begun!
- ★ Arnold (cat) goes missing on his way to his new home. Heartbreaking :(
- ★ Lake County shelter euthanizing for space, MCACS at capacity

<u>WINS</u>

- ★ Fear Free!! We have our first board member certified in Fear Free Shelters- Julie Dauer! Who will be next? Julie wants to encourage anyone thinking of joining us by saying: "The information solidifies that we've been going in the right direction and even ahead of the curve!"
- ★ Longterm dog resident Rip finds a foster home with Leanna!
- ★ Devan and the Bergin students were onsite on 3/17, 3/24 & 3/31 learning with our dogs, we are so lucky to have this partnership!
- ★ Our community rallies and helps us keep up with our laundry during water leak

FUTURE

- ★ Fear Free Shelter 2025
- ★ Devan and Bergin students final FINAL project- an onsite public learning event called SUPERSIZED Skillz Sunday on 4/6
- ★ Expo is just around the corner! Staff prepared to hold down the fort while Jenny and Becca are away
- ★ Jenny & Becca will prepare synopsis of Animal Welfare Conference for the Board for the next board meeting
- ★ Looking for additional support from local veterinary offices
- ★ Negotiation with San Diego Zoo to create a live exhibit of exotics amongst the wildflowers in our upper field. Negotiations to be finalized on April 1 - more info coming in the next board report
