Shelter Operations Wins/Challenges

CHALLENGES

- ★ Intakes halted and full quarantine of cat intake room due to panleukopenia
- ★ Short staffed for a week and a half in October
- ★ Not enough volunteer support for the animals onsite, behavioral decline from lack of walks/attention
- ★ Duffy escapes his adoptive home and search party is immediately activated!
- ★ Feral cat, Chardonnay, gets caught in a large Live Oak Tree (native to California) over hanging dog kennel # 7 where Prince Stuart resides.
 Lucky for Chardonnay, Prince likes cats = 1

WINS

- ★ Halloween was fun! Staff dressed up and Teresa joined us to pass our treats and accept donations from our community!
- ★ Duffy is found and reunited with his owners, he now wears a GPS tracker collar! Thanks to all the efforts of our volunteers, fosters and community who jumped into action as soon as we needed them
- ★ Dugan attends his first ever adoption event in four years at Joe's Pumpkin Patch! This was a great venue and turn out for our dogs and volunteers!
- ★ Chardonnay comes down safely from the tree!
- ★ Josie goes camping on the Oregon Coast with foster Tracy Daly

FUTURE

- ★ Thanksgiving and Christmas adoption specials! We hope to see many animals go home before the holidays
- ★ Quoted out custom housing for Cat Intake to meet VCA guidelines and basic animal needs - sourcing donor
- ★ In addition to our weekly dog and cat team meetings, weekly leadership meetings, and monthly staff meetings, regular "office team" meetings will be starting in November. Communication is key to a successful team!
