Days turned into weeks, then months, and Randy patiently put his time and energy into building a friendship. Aurora stopped barking at him, and soon, he became one of the few volunteers she deemed worthy of leashing her up and taking her out. A best friendship had formed, and now we were the ones asking Randy, "So... when are you adopting Aurora?!"

Adopting a dog is a family affair. While Randy often joked about "surrendering his wife to take Aurora home," the truth is, a successful adoption involves everyone in the household being on board—and Randy was aiming for success. So, he tested the waters by asking if he could foster Aurora. One day, she loaded up and went home with him for a "weekend."

Aurora's foster vacations quickly turned from weekends into weeks, then months. Over time, and after many deals made for treats, she worked her way into the hearts of the whole family.

And on December 29, 2024, after 955 days in our care, Aurora was officially adopted. She had convinced the entire Gamble family that she was home to stay...

TAKING FEAR OUT OF FeLV

Word of our Feline Leukemia (FeLV) cat program is spreading—and lives are being saved because of it! Over the last few years, we've welcomed FeLV-positive cats from Humboldt, Lake, and Santa Cruz counties. Now, we're thrilled to share that Napa Animal Shelter recently joined the list.

When Napa reached out about a sweet cat, Trisha, who had tested positive for FeLV and was at risk of euthanasia without a transfer option, we didn't hesitate—we said YES. Thanks to volunteer Machiko, who made the long roundtrip drive to Napa, our newest FeLV kitty arrived safely and is now settling beautifully into life at the Cottage.

Even more exciting? Our ongoing work with FeLV cats inspired Napa to consider creating their own FeLV program! We were proud to share resources from Austin Pets Alive, along with tips on counseling adopters, highlighting FeLV cats in marketing, and helping the public understand that these cats can still live happy, love-filled lives.

What is Feline Leukemia (FeLV)?

Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV) is a virus that affects a cat's immune system. While it can shorten a cat's lifespan, many FeLV+ cats live happy, healthy lives for several months to years—especially in a stress-free, indoor environment with regular veterinary care.



A COMMUNITY EFFORT: GETTING LOST PETS BACK HOME

In March, a heartwarming story unfolded that showcased the power of community in reuniting lost pets with their families. An employee at Weathertop Nursery in Laytonville named David played a crucial role in ensuring a stray dog found his way home.

When the dog showed up at the nursery, David knew exactly what to do. He safely secured the dog and brought him inside to keep him warm and safe. Next, David had the dog scanned for a microchip, hoping for a quick solution.

The good news? The dog was chipped! David reached out to HSIMC in hopes we could track down the chip registry and locate an owner. The challenging part? The chip was registered, but the contact information was outdated, leaving David with only the owner's name to work with.



Thanks to David's persistence and compassion, the lost dog was returned home safely.

This story is a shining example of how our community plays a vital role in ensuring lost pets make it back to their families. Whether it's scanning for microchips, calling HSIMC for help, or simply keeping a found pet safe, each action makes a difference.

If you find a stray animal, please remember to take the time to check for a microchip, as it can be the key to unlocking a happy ending!

FINDING HOPE AFTER THE STORM

I wanted to share my story in the hopes that it helps anyone else who has gone through something similar with their dogs.

For almost six years, I had three rescue pups who were inseparable. We were a family that did everything together—sleeping, going on trips, and taking long walks. My two girls played rough but always got along, and I never worried about dog aggression. But after my oldest dog, my male, passed away, everything changed.

At the same time, I was already going through unimaginable loss—losing my husband and our home. And then, my two girls, who had always been best friends, suddenly turned on each other. It wasn't just a scuffle—it was vicious.

Instinctively, I stepped in to break up the fight, which was not the safest choice, but I couldn't stand by and watch. If I hadn't intervened, I believe it would have been a fight to the death. We were all injured, physically and emotionally.

I was devastated. My child and my dogs are my entire world, and I felt completely hopeless. On top of that, I was judged harshly by those around me for keeping both dogs. But I couldn't imagine giving up on either of them.

That's when HSIMC stepped in. They were incredible. They had Zoom calls with me every couple of weeks and connected me with a trainer. I held onto hope that I could slowly reintroduce my dogs and rebuild their bond. In the meantime, I kept them completely separate, rotating them between different areas of the house. My plan was to let them see each other again after a few months.

But then, an accidental face-to-face encounter led to another severe fight, and I realized that reconciliation wasn't an option. At the time, it felt like my family was completely torn apart. I thought my life would never feel whole again.

Now, six months later, I've come to realize that dogs can still have full, happy lives even if they have to live separately.



We've established a routine with safety measures in place—gates, locked doors, and structured rotations. My dogs understand the system, and while life looks different now, we are still a family.

We are all healing, but we are okay. And if you ever find yourself in this situation, please know that you are not alone. You don't have to give up one of your dogs. You don't have to make an impossible choice. There are options, and there is hope, even when it doesn't feel like it.

If you ever have concerns with a pet you've adopted, reach out to HSIMC. They are amazing and will always do everything they can to support both the rescue animals and their adopters.

These are the hands of a foster.


These are the hands that will help us save hundreds of lives this year.

Looking for a way to make a real difference? Join our volunteer team and help us change lives - both furry and human!

- Volunteer Orientation is held twice a month:
- First Thursday and Last Sunday of each month
- 11:00 AM at the shelter

Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County is excited to announce our partner-ship with the GoodPup dog training app! GoodPup offers customized, affordable, positive dog training that you can access from the comfort of your home, at a time that works for YOU.

We are really excited about the possibility of better-behaved dogs! (And fewer dogs that need new homes due to behavioral issues.) GoodPup offers one week of free training; there is no obligation, and users can cancel at any time.

Here's what else to know:

• If you've ever adopted a dog from HSIMC, you can sign up for the GoodPup app, and get a lifetime discount off their services. (This is good for HSIMC fosters, volunteers, and staff members, too.)

For everyone who keeps up with GoodPup beyond the first week of training, HSIMC will receive \$40 from the company – whether the dog is from us or not! These funds will help us with our behavior program so we can continue to support the needs of our dogs who are onsite or in homes (Remember, that first week is free.)

We live in a rural community with limited resources to sound training techniques. We love that this virtual training experience can help people and their pups from the comfort of their own home.

We hope this helps some puppies learn how to be good dogs, and also helps some old dogs learn new tricks!
