STAFFING

- ★ 9 Employees (6 FT, 3 PT)
- ★ Staff works together to capture loose dog Delilah- a great team effort involving both teams, her fosters and Jenny!
- ★ Becca was accepted into a 9 month course and coaching journey called “The Journey You Own” through Maddies Fund and Dr. Joythi V. Robertson!
- ★ Raeann is scheduled to return to active duty on January 14th

MEDICAL

- ★ Behavior + medical euthanasia of Awnie
- ★ Speed Racer was run over by a wheel chair prior to coming to HSIMC and suffers a mid shaft oblique tibial fracture
- ★ Morticia, senior cat abandoned at HSIMC’s gate last month, is diagnosed with hyperthyroidism and requires ongoing medication.
- ★ Rachel continues to need follow up radiographs for her pneumonia diagnosis. Symptoms have improved with treatment but x-rays have not.
- ★ Ollie goes to EHV to have his Freestyle Libre placed, his foster will be shown how to apply it in the future. Care will be transferred to Wasson on Dec 13th. Once regulated/stable he will be adopted by his foster!

Shelter Operations Wins/Challenges

CHALLENGES

- ★ ANIMAL ABANDONMENT:
Four cats
- ★ Hoarding case of small mom dog and puppies living in their own feces were brought in with no room at the inn
- ★ Delilah escapes her kennel and runs down to the river behind the shelter after pushing past a broken gate
- ★ Dog kennels are breaking and causing issues for dog housing
- ★ Abuse towards staff verbally, by phone, and email, is increasing due to frustration in the community over lack of animal care services

WINS

- ★ Coast is able to take on hoarding case of mom and small dog
- ★ Delilah's fosters were able to help collect her from the river wilds!
- ★ Mendocino Barkery Event was a great success! Three dogs found their homes and Rosa did FANTASTIC running her first event alongside Kelsey
- ★ Cats are caught up on spay/neuter surgeries!

- ★ FREE DOG TRAINERS?!?
- ★ Becca to attend wellness retreat at Maddie's Fund headquarters through her 'Journey You Own' Leadership course, in January
- ★ Animal Balance 2026!

Leadership

2026 Budget Development

Preliminary budget for 2026 has been submitted for review to the Finance Committee, adjustments have been made, board will vote at the December meeting.

Wellness Clinic - Spring/Summer 2026

The date is set - Wellness Clinic to take place on Sunday March 1st at the Redwood Valley Grange.

This Wellness Clinic will be for staff, board members, fosters, MCACS staff, volunteers, and others who work in the animal welfare field. Invitations to be sent out to rescue partners to ensure they have an opportunity to participate. Thank you Redwood Valley Grange for 50% off on the rental rate!

Behavior Support Program Transition

With existing behavior support programs dissipating - we seek new avenues to continue providing the support our community needs. The goal is always to keep pets in homes. Free Dog Trainers fills this growing void, we seek approval from the Board to approve Q1 & Q2 for 2026.

Partnership with MCACS – Animal Balance Project

HSIMC is collaborating with Mendocino County Animal Care Services on the upcoming Animal Balance project, with appointments currently scheduled for March 6th-8th, May 1st-3rd, and July - awaiting confirmation on dates. Looking to schedule 2 additional clinics but funding sources will be needed. This initiative will increase access to high volume/low cost spay/neuter for 1,000 animals in Mendocino County. HSIMC's office and medical team has volunteered to work the clinics and will seek a volunteer to lead feeding the amazing team making this happen. Breakfast, lunch and snacks will be needed for each day of the clinics. The volunteer will take the lead on sourcing food from local establishments who can donate for this incredible opportunity coming to Mendocino County.

Pet Pantry Program Expansion

As the number of pet owners we support continues to grow we need our pet pantry to fully open. A volunteer has been sourced to install the ventilation needed on the container, Blue Ribbon Pets has donated some shelving to get us started and we are seeking an HSIMC volunteer to take on and run the program. Volunteer job description is in the works. SOP has already been created. We are also seeking additional partnerships with organizations that can help supply pet food and other items that would benefit the community having access to for the pets.

Facility and Infrastructure Needs

Outdoor dog kennels are requiring more frequent repairs due to wear and weather exposure. We are evaluating long-term solutions to "build back better," focusing on durable, animal-safe, and efficient designs that meet ASV Guidelines for animals housing.
