- Jessie came to us from Clear Lake Animal Association with only one intact eye and a severe upper respiratory infection. Once his URI was clear he had his missing eye
- socket cleaned up and closed. He is now adopted!

cause, Dr. Cannon said the damage to his leg was extensive and amputation was his best option. There have been a few complications since his amputation but he is now on the right path for healing in a foster home with Kelsey
