STAFFING

- ★ 10 Employees (7 FT, 3 PT)
- ★ Fear Free! All Animal Care Staff are officially Fear Free Shelter Graduates!
- ★ Capacity for Care resulting in less illness and loss of life, we hope to see this trend continue by paying close attention to our ability to provide proper care to the animals that come to us and knowing when to say no
- ★ Triaging intakes and scheduling them when possible helps provide higher quality of care



MEDICAL

- ★ Taquito newborn kitten brought in. Had severe cleft palate and pneumonia, did not survive.
- ★ Pablo comes to us with a open laceration around his anus, East Hill was able to fix him up but x-rays reveal he will need additional surgery for a broken elbow
- ★ Bunkers diagnostic tests for underlying health conditions, leading to suspected IBD and ongoing treatment.

- ★ Our team has been rocking kitten season by keeping them in foster homes or quickly finding adoptive homes for them!
