
SUPER HEROES WEAR CAPES WHEN THEY NEED TO

Whether it is just spays and neuters, traumatic injuries or four-week-old kittens with Swimmer's Syndrome, we can always depend on Dr. Chana and her team at East Hill Veterinary Clinic to be there when we call.

Dr. Chana does 700+ alteration surgeries for our shelter every year and it is clear that we couldn't do all that we can without her on our team. If a cat, like Alice, comes in with a life-threatening injury we know that she can be seen right away. With Dr. Chana's expertise, Alice's injury is nearly completely healed and she has normal use of her leg again.

Sometimes, there are rare cases that our shelter has never seen before. Toad was born with Swimmer's Syndrome, a congenital condition that causes the kitten's hind legs to splay outwards and if left untreated can cause the kitten to be unable to stand and walk. Within two weeks of his diagnosis Toad was able to walk and play just like his siblings due to medical intervention from Dr. Chana and physical therapy with his foster home.

Dr. Chana and her team may not wear capes daily but they are SUPER HEROS ALWAYS for our community's animals.

THIS IS CAL CAT'S INCREDIBLE STORY....

Do you believe in miracles? We certainly do!

On the night of May 4th, after wrapping up the successful Black and White Gala, our board members were on their way home following the event's clean-up. Everyone was looking forward to some well-deserved rest when tragedy unexpectedly struck...A tabby cat suddenly darted out onto the road and was struck by one of our board members.

In a state of panic and sorrow, a frantic phone call was made to our management team: "I hit a cat, it's still alive," she said, her voice trembling with emotion.

Upon arriving at the scene, we found the cat suffering from visible injuries. With care and compassion, we gently placed him in a crate, brought him back to the shelter, and provided him with warmth and a soft blanket. The situation looked grim, but we refused to give up hope. If he could hold on until morning, we were ready to rush him to the nearest available vet for urgent care.

Much to our surprise, at 7 am when we opened the door to the intake room, we were greeted with a faint "Meow." In disbelief, we rushed him over to Wasson Veterinary Clinic, where Dr. Cannon was waiting to assess whether his life could be saved or if it was time to end his suffering.

Cal Cat continued to surprise us as Dr. Cannon later called with an update. Despite his severe injuries—a pneumothorax, head trauma with potential eye loss, broken jaw and a dislocated tail from his pelvis—he was still fighting, and she believed she could save him!



It's never a lucky day when you're hit by a car, but Cal Cat couldn't have been luckier to cross paths with the right vehicle that night. Instead of succumbing to his injuries on the roadside, Cal was headed into surgery, thanks to the quick thinking of our dedicated team.

This resilient cat, who lost his tail and likely several of his nine lives that fateful night, is not only a survivor but also the sweetest feline who shows nothing but gratitude with gentle head butts to all his caregivers. Cal Cat is now back onsite, bravely recovering from his surgeries and in search of a loving foster home.

Despite the battle scars he will forever carry, we remain in awe of his gentle demeanor and unwavering will to live!

For dogs like Jordy, extended time in a kennel can be their downfall. But with support from our volunteers and behavior team we can do so much more to provide the quality of life these dogs need while they wait.

FOSTER WARNING:

Before fostering animals from Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County, please be aware of the following potential side effects:

- **Feelings of Overwhelming Love**: You may experience a profound sense of affection and attachment toward your foster animals. Symptoms include spontaneous smiling, frequent petting, and a deep bond that forms quickly.
- **Increased Companionship:** Expect a notable increase in companionship. This can result in daily interactions with a loyal and grateful animal, leading to less loneliness and more joy in your home.
- **Frequent Laughter:** Be prepared for frequent moments of laughter caused by playful antics and endearing behaviors of your foster pet. This side effect is common and can be highly contagious.
- Enhanced Sense of Purpose: Many foster caregivers report a heightened sense of purpose and fulfillment from helping an animal in need. This may lead to a greater overall sense of well-being and satisfaction.
- Strengthened Community Ties: You might find yourself more connected with your local community through involvement with the shelter and fellow animal lovers. Symptoms include making new friends and expanding your social network.
- **Risk of Foster Failures:** Be aware that fostering may lead to an inability to say goodbye, resulting in permanent adoption. This side effect is known as a "foster failure" and is often accompanied by lifelong joy and a happy home for your pet. At HSIMC, we call these "foster success" stories!

In Case of Overwhelming Love:

If you find the love too overwhelming, adoption services are available to make your foster pet a permanent member of your family.

Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County is excited to announce our partnership with the GoodPup dog training app! GoodPup offers customized, affordable, positive dog training that you can access from the comfort of your home, at a time that works for YOU.

We are really excited about the possibility of better-behaved dogs! (And fewer dogs that need new homes due to behavioral issues.) GoodPup offers one week of free training; there is no obligation, and users can cancel at any time. Here's what else to know:

• If you've ever adopted a dog from HSIMC, you can sign up for the GoodPup app, and get a lifetime discount off their services. (This is good for HSIMC fosters, volunteers, and staff members, too.)

For everyone who keeps up with GoodPup beyond the first week of training, HSIMC will receive \$40 from the company – whether the dog is from us or not! These funds will help us with our behavior program so we can continue to support the needs of our dogs who are onsite or in homes (Remember, that first week is free.)

We live in a rural community with limited resources to sound training techniques. We love that this virtual training experience can help people and their pups from the comfort of their own home.

We hope this helps some puppies learn how to be good dogs, and also helps some old dogs learn new tricks! Thank you, GoodPup!

Letter from our Board President

Saturday May 4, 2024 HSIMC held their 2nd annual Gala event at the Barra winery and event center. The theme was "Black and White Ball" and everyone was encouraged to get dressed up and come out to support the shelter. It was a sellout, and attendees were quite excited to have an event where they could showcase their nicest outfits. The Gala was started in 2023 as a means for HSIMC to sponsor a sit-down dinner and auction fundraiser, in 2023 HSIMC set a record for the largest fundraising event in our history. Well records are made to be broken and the 2024 Gala was an absolute resounding success, every facet of the event was bigger and better than the previous year and naturally a new record was established!

As everyone knows, the shelter operates on a very limited budget and we are extremely frugal in our outlay. The priorities for spending, more often than not leaves very little capital available for facility repairs and improvements. Our shelter, while functional, is old and much of it is outdated and in desperate need of upgrade, the operating mode has been to address a need when it fails and has to be repaired or replaced. When the Gala concept was initiated, we decided to include a "Fund the Need" portion, this is a fundraising event where we identify our specific desires for upgrades and repairs and every penny that is raised via this vehicle is earmarked and reserved for that purpose.

I am very pleased to announce that since we started this campaign in 2023 and with your very generous support, over \$50k has been raised for Fund the Need at the two galas, this year having achieved a 50% increase over last year's amount. That is a lot of money and when you consider that we endeavor to support all of our construction activities with volunteer labor, this sum, primarily for materials is huge. Slowly you have seen some of the changes at the shelter and we will continue to modernize and improve the facilities for the safety and benefit of our animals and employees.

Producing a Gala event is not a simple task, it requires many hours of meticulous planning and coordination, many, many volunteers, who may be providing a product or professional service, at no cost or just simply providing labor for set-up, clean up, or serving our guests. Based on the results I think HSIMC has the formula, but only due to all of the VOLUNTEERS who help in making this a success. There are lots of people involved and without your support and commitment this effort would be much harder than it is. So, THANK YOU to everyone for all your help!

During the quarter we also sponsored Wags and Wine at Barra, attended Mendo Pride in Hopland and the annual Jeep event, which this year was held at Thurston Auto Plaza. All of these events, whether we bring animals or not give us exposure and an opportunity to tell our story, plus hopefully raise a few dollars. A new future event which we will roll-out on June 29 is a Disc golf tournament to be held at Anderson Valley Brewery. We anticipate adding this to our calendar as an annual event. The annual Kritter Karnival will be held September 22nd so don't miss this. It is a great event with lots of child-oriented activities in a safe environment.

Again, this year our sincere thanks to Fowler Subaru and Subaru of America for choosing HSIMC as the recipient of their annual "Share the Love" campaign, this was the 16th year in a row that Subaru of America has sponsored this event, donating millions of dollars annually to local charities. HSIMC can certainly feel the love!

Change is good, and in this light, after 2 years at the helm of the Board of Directors I have decided to move out of the way and make room for someone else to inject some fresh thinking/ideas, direction, and to continue to build on the progress that has been achieved in recent years. There have been many achievements during my tenure and I'd like to think that I was a driving force behind this. But the reality is that sometimes all it takes is an idea or concept for people to rally around and then momentum takes over. Two things that really standout, that go hand in hand and have been instrumental at HSIMC are: 1)Constructing a business model which, while optimizing operations also constrains and prevents us from overextending our resources and creating financial stress. 2) Achieving a strong financial foundation and establishing a cash reserve for getting the shelter through the lean times.

I will continue to serve on the Board of Directors and expect to be a strong and vocal advocate for doing things right, making sure we are not penny wise, pound foolish and continuing to cultivate relationships for our mutual benefit.

We had an amazing second quarter and have so much to share with you all!

First and foremost, we hope you are doing well and staying cool as temperatures rise with the onset of summer. Here at the shelter, this time of year brings unique challenges, especially in keeping our on site residents comfortable. With limited cool spots available for our dogs to relax during the heat of the day, we rely heavily on our incredible team of fosters, volunteers, and dedicated staff to provide a more comfortable and habitable environment for the dogs residing on site. Their efforts are invaluable, and we are immensely grateful for their commitment.

Two of our staff also attended the Animal Care Expo in San Antonio, Texas back in May. This opportunity allowed us to learn, grow, and engage with some of the leading voices in animal welfare. The connections we made have provided us with invaluable support and mentorship, which will undoubtedly enhance our efforts here at the shelter.

One exciting initiative we are bringing back from the Expo is "Kitten College"! So, what is Kitten College?

Kitten College is a nonprofit organization offering vital support to animal shelters and rescues working to save neonatal kittens. Through education, resource sharing, and training, they strive to decrease euthanasia while increasing the quality of life for these vulnerable felines. Their goal is to provide these services at little to shelters and rescues. We plan to invite our community to join us for Kitten College on September 15th, 2024. This quarter, we also participated in CalAnimals' Adopt-a-Pet Day, a statewide event that brought people and pets together across California.

Organized by CalAnimals, whose mission is to support the success of animal welfare and sheltering organizations in meeting the needs of animals and people in their communities. This event, on June 1st, featured more than 150 animal welfare organization and with the SF SPCA offering free adoptions, CalAnimals set a goal to find homes for 2,024 shelter pets. We are delighted to report that the goal was exceeded, with 3,609 adoptions taking place! The SF SPCA generously reimbursed adoption fees across the participating rescue organizations to the tune of \$373,000!

Wrapping up Q2, we also want to shout out Creative Workshop in Ukiah. This locally owned business has offered to print our newsletters each quarter and we are thrilled to have them join our team. You will not find a nicer group of people to work with and we are so grateful to Robert and his team for helping HSIMC provide a well printed and newsletter style booklet for the stories we share with all of you.
