Kessler, did knowingly use a computer online service, internet service, local bulletin board service, or any other device capable of electronic data storage or transmission to seduce, solicit, lure, or entice, or attempt to seduce, solicit, lure, or entice a child or another person believed to be a child, to commit any illegal act described in Chapter 794, Chapter 800, or Chapter 827, Florida Statutes to wit: Lewd and Lascivious Battery, Lewd and Lascivious Molestation, Lewd and Lascivious Conduct, and/or Sexual Battery; or to otherwise engage in any unlawful sexual conduct with a child or with another person believed to be a child, contrary to Section 847.0135(3)(a), Florida Statutes.

COUNT II: On or about October 12, 2011, Phillip M. 
