As you plan your visit and consider what to bring, we thought it might be helpful to share some detail about our amazing campground!

Our tents are equipped with queen sized beds and upgraded linens. Pillows and throw blankets (during cooler months) are included for your comfort. If you need additional sleeping capacity, we offer oversized cots, equipped with linens, on a nightly rental basis. We provide a “Welcome Bucket” in each tent which includes necessities such as toilet paper, wet wipes, bug spray, candles, fire starter and fire extinguisher. Our campsites all have dedicated firepits, picnic tables, Adirondack chairs, trash cans, freshwater container, camp style grills, fire grates, tiki torches and overhead lighting for nighttime use. We have firewood and charcoal available for purchase onsite or you are welcome to bring your own. We have a porta toilet located at the campsite. At our main cabin on the “Back Porch”, we have a newly constructed bath / restroom facility for your use. The “Back Porch” is also home to our morning coffee bar.

The Tent

We pride ourselves on providing a high quality, safe and comfortable tent.

- We provide a “Welcome Bucket” inside each tent for your use. Please feel free to use any of these supplies that you require and leave the balance for the next guest.
- Your tent is equipped with a fire extinguisher. Please locate it and keep it accessible in case of emergency.
- Linens are washed after each guest stay and are placed in your tent only within 24 hours of arrival. **Please keep ALL linens inside the tent.**
- Your tent is accented with candles and battery-operated lights for your nighttime enjoyment.
- Your tent is equipped with a heating source (Propane Heater) during colder months. Please feel free to bring your own propane or you may purchase it on site.
- Each tent is equipped with a box fan that should be used at nighttime only. Use of the fan drains your power source so please conserve as much as possible.

The Camp

We have provided the items below for your comfort and convenience.

- **Adirondack Chairs** – each tent is provided with a minimum of two chairs. Feel free to move these around as you like but please return them to the original location upon checkout.
- **Bath House** - The bath house is located at the “Back Porch” which is on the lower level of the main cabin. Follow posted signs for “Back Porch” until you arrive “Coffee Bar / Bath House”. The bath house is open from 7:00 AM – 10:00 PM daily. Please bring your own towels and soap / shampoo.
- **Coffee Bar** - The coffee bar is located at the “Back Porch” which is on the lower level of the main cabin. Follow posted signs for “Back Porch” until you arrive “Coffee Bar / Bath House”. The coffee is open from 7:00 AM – 10:00 PM daily. Keurig coffee, creamers, sweetener and to go cups are provided.

- **Firepit** – Each tent has its own private firepit. You are free to pick up and burn any dead wood you find on the ground. Please do not cut any standing trees or limbs. We also have firewood for purchase, or you are free to bring your own.
- **Grills** – The camps are equipped with park style charcoal grills and fire grates for your cooking. Feel free to use these but please make sure the coals are properly extinguished after each use. Should you need charcoal we can provide it for a charge, or you can purchase it locally.
- **Ice** – At Pop’s Place you will find ice in the porch deep freeze. Please leave a tip so we can replenish for our next guest. There is also a good chance the kids will find some complementary popsicles in the deep freeze.
- **Overhead Lighting** – Each camp area is equipped with overhead lighting that should be used at nighttime only. Use of the lights drains your power source so please conserve as much as possible.
- **Picnic Tables** – Each camp area is equipped with a picnic table for your dedicated use. There are additional tables around the property. Feel free to use these but we ask, for safety reasons, that you do not move them.
- **Toilet** – There is a porta toilet located in the camp common area. The toilet is serviced and cleaned on a regular basis. There is also a full service toilet located at the bath house.
- **Torches** – We provide torches at each tent and around the common area. Please feel free to bring your own citronella fluid or you can purchase it on site.
- **WIFI:** The camp is not equipped with WIFI, but we do have good cellular service on several networks. If you need to urgently connect to WIFI please let us know and we can provide the Cabin password for short term use. McDonald’s also offers complimentary WIFI and is a great spot to sit, check email and people watch!

The Property

- **Enitachopco Creek** – Take some time and enjoy our creek.
 - **Fishing** - Enitachopco is renowned for great redeye bass fishing! Largemouth bass and multiple species of bream call our creek home. For conservation / sustainability purposes we do ask that you catch

and release and that you use barbless hooks. (We have files available to remove barbs)

- **Creek Floats** – We offer a limited number of floats for your use. The floats are complimentary but if damaged or lost cost \$100 to replace. Feel free to bring your own floats for summer time enjoyment.
- **Archery Range** – New for 2021, we have an archery range for the kids to enjoy free of charge. Liability waiver is required.
- **BB Shooting Range** – We offer a tin can range and complimentary BB guns for the kid's enjoyment.
- **Trails** – We have several miles of well-groomed roads / trails circling the property. Please take time to get out and explore and enjoy the woods and wildlife. "Mattox Loop" does require crossing of small shallow creeks so plan accordingly. For your convenience all trails are well marked with Camp Hidden Creek signage.

Safety

- Hunting – Absolutely NO Guest Hunting is allowed on our property. We are a wilderness property and at certain times of the year hunting may occur nearby. Rest assured our neighbors are aware that we have guest on property, and they will act responsibly. During peak hunting season months (November through January) we suggest that you wear bright colors while hiking. We have orange vest available at The Cabin for your use, free of charge.
- Pets – We are a Pet Friendly property and welcome our furry friends. For the safety and enjoyment of all, we do request that you always keep your furry family nearby and under control.
- Weapons – Although we are strong 2nd Amendment supporters, we do not allow guest to discharge weapons on property. Obviously, the exception being if you or your family are in imminent danger of any kind.
- Wildlife – We are a wilderness property and have lots of wildlife around. You are likely to see deer, turkey, rabbit, squirrel, racoon, opossum, armadillo, coyote, fox, bobcat, hawks, owls, buzzards, ducks and other animals. In almost every instance these animals are fearful of humans and will run away. We also have multiple species of snakes on property including king snakes, rat snakes, black racers, rattlesnakes, cotton mouth / water moccasin and copperheads. If you encounter any snakes, please give them their space. We are a respect and protect property and do not

condone killing of these creatures. If you need assistance relocating one of our legless friends, contact us immediately.

- Ensure that your campfire has been properly extinguished.
- Contact your host and advise them that you are departing.
