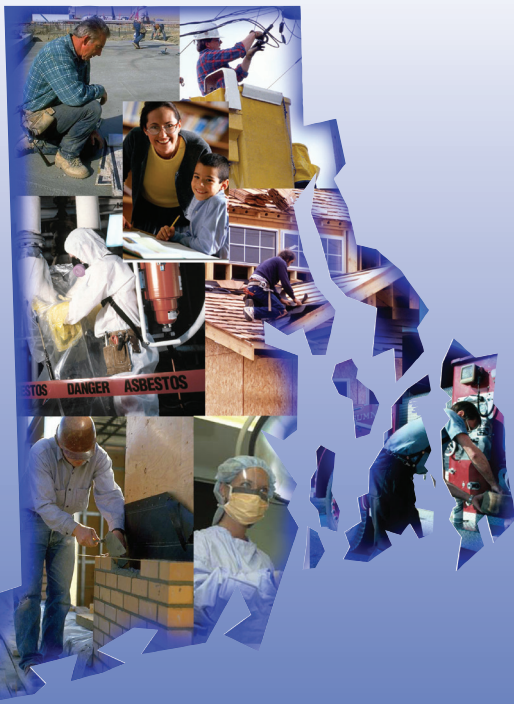

Union members receive the rebate from Union Plus to help offset the costs of moving services from the current provider to AT&T; and the \$36 activation fee is waived for union members switching carriers.

\$100 Smartphone Upgrade Rebate:

Whether you are an existing AT&T customer or are planning to switch, you are eligible for a \$100 rebate from Union Plus when you upgrade to a new smartphone with an AT&T data plan.

“Shameful Services”

Wal-Mart/Sam's Club

The corporate policies and practices used by Wal-Mart aren't just vehemently anti-union, they stifle small business ownership and transfer jobs overseas. Store managers go out of their way to quash union activity in their stores and most recently five stores have been shut down for workers insisting on unionization votes. We encourage our members not to shop in Rhode Island stores or while out of state, especially after the unearthing of their most recent anti-union campaign video.

Staples

The AFL-CIO at the request of the American Postal Workers' Union has asked all members to boycott all purchases at Staples after the chain was awarded a deal to divert good-paying government jobs to a company that makes decisions based only on their bottom line. This will compromise the quality, security and reliability that consumers expect of their regular postal employees and put the tasks in the hands of minimum wage employees with high turnover rates that care nothing for returning customers.

Currently all COX services are non-union.

What Does “Union Labor” Mean?

A union company’s workers are represented by a labor organization for collective bargaining. Workers, union representatives and management negotiate fair wages, benefits and working conditions together, which are written into a contract. Union members elect their leaders, and hire or elect staff representatives. These staff representatives work in conjunction with union workers and the employer to ensure the terms mutually agreed upon in contract negotiations are properly carried out.

Union workers earn better wages, have better benefits, enjoy dignity and respect on the job and are able to provide greater economic stability for themselves, their families and their communities than their non-union counterparts.

How Do You Know Something Is Union Made?

In manufactured goods, look for a “Union Bug,” (see back cover.) These labels ensure that you are buying quality goods that were manufactured by union workers. For union services provided in Rhode Island, please refer to this booklet. If you have any doubts, ask someone which union represents the company’s workers. Reputable unionized firms will respect your request and be more than happy to help.
