# RICOSH ANNUAL REPORT 2018

The RI Committee on Occupational Safety and Health {RICOSH} is a (non-profit) resource center for occupational and environmental health and safety. Our primary focus is to prevent occupational and environmental disease and injury. RICOSH pursues this goal in three broad areas: advocacy, training, and technical assistance.

## An Advocate for Occupational & Environmental Safety & Health

- RICOSH continues to advocate for policies to protect workers in state and local resiliency
  and response/adaptation plans mandated by the Resilient Rhode Island Act, the state's
  comprehensive climate change legislation; and the Governor's Resilient Rhody Strategy.
- We are advocating a new policy to address climate change for the entire community by proposing the creation of a greenhouse gas emissions infrastructure bank to the Rhode Island Executive Climate Change Coordinating Council and RI's Chief Resiliency Officer (RIIB) who are both charged to develop comprehensive state policy on climate change. RICOSH continues to work for improvement for public transit systems, especially as a key remediation to climate change impacts.
- We joined with a new coalition Fix Our Schools: a Coalition for Healthy School Environments to
  address deteriorating conditions of many RI school buildings. The coalition succeeded in
  helping to enact a statewide referendum and many local district/municipal referendums to
  provide hundreds of million of dollars to 'fix out schools'.
- RICOSH's has been providing background information to the RI Congressional delegation on the impact of policies and programs proposed by the Trump administration regarding the US Chemical Safety Board, US OSHA and the US EPA.
- RICOSH has joined with a national coalition of unions and occupational health professionals
  and advocates to address occupational heat stress issues especially as one key impact of our
  changing climate will be more frequent days of extreme heat.
- RICOSH developed outreach information for public safety and emergency response regarding impact of the opioid crisis.

# Training and Education

'Throughout decades of workplace and environmental health and safety advocacy, RICOSH has educated and trained workers - as well as community members and agencies and professionals - about classical job hazards like asbestos, lead and carbon monoxide and emerging hazards like nanoparticles and emerging infectious diseases.' Worker-centered health and safety training is fundamental to any attempt to prevent and control workplace hazards.

We trained over 160 young, new, immigrant, minority and low wage workers on job health and safety issues and OSHA in 2018 through a US OSHA Susan B Harwood grant. All told, since 2010 **RICOSH has** trained over 1040 workers in recognition of workplace hazards and the role OSHA under the Harwood grant awards.



#### [TNEC-CSEA]

Since 1987, The New England Consortium (TNEC-CSEA), a partnership of the University of Massachusetts Lowell in the Department of Community Health, and five New England COSH groups and the Civil Service Employees Association, Local 1000, AFSCME funded by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences through the National Worker Education Training Program. TNEC-CSEA has conducted top quality learner-centered participatory hands-on Hazardous Waste Worker and Emergency Responder Health and Safety Training throughout the region.
